

**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION**

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Aztec Oil & Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on August 20, 1969, for permission to dually complete its Reese Mesa Well No. 1 located in Unit H of Section 12, Township 32 North, Range 8 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

NOW, on this 3rd day of September, 1969, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That waivers of objection have been received from offsetting operators and the waiting period as prescribed by said rule may be dispensed with at this time.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Aztec Oil & Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Reese Mesa Well No. 1 located in Unit H of Section 12, Township 32 North, Range 8 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

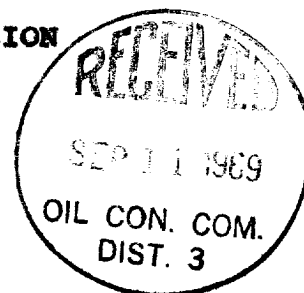
That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

Under the provisions of Rule 113-A, Artes Oil & Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on August 20, 1959, for permission to dually complete its Reed No. 1 Well No. 1 located in Unit H of Section 12, Township 13 North, Range 6 West, N.M.P., San Juan County, New Mexico, in order to produce gas from the Blanco-Messavado Pool and the Reed No. 1 Lakota Pool.

Now, on this 20th day of September, 1959, the Secretary of the Commission, after having read the application and the report of the Director, finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 113-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided and all operators of offset wells have been duly notified; and
- (3) That waiver of objection have been received from all offset operators and the waiting period as prescribed by said rule may be dispensed with at this time.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause any not repair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Artes Oil & Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Reed No. 1 Well No. 1 located in Unit H of Section 12, Township 13 North, Range 6 West, N.M.P., San Juan County, New Mexico, in order to produce gas from the Blanco-Messavado Pool and the Reed No. 1 Lakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall comply, operate and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 113-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall file a report of completion and annual production therefrom.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Secretary of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
