

THE APPLICATION OF EL PASO NATURAL
GAS COMPANY FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-2234

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, El Paso Natural Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on January 7, 1976, for permission to dually complete its Beaver Lodge Com Well No. 2R located in Unit A of Section 36, Township 31 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit production of gas from the Pictured Cliffs formation adjacent to the Blanco-Pictured Cliffs Pool and from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool.

Now, on this 27th day of January, 1976, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, El Paso Natural Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Beaver Lodge Com Well No. 2R located in Unit A of Section 36, Township 31 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit production of gas from the Pictured Cliffs formation adjacent to the Blanco-Pictured Cliffs Pool and from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, that applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

waste nor impact relative rights;
- (4) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are
feasible and consistent with good conservation practices;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Beverly Lodge Com Well No. 1, located in Santa Fe County, New Mexico, Range 11 North, Range 11 West, T10N, R11W, S10E, New Mexico, 10, be and the same is hereby authorized to develop a lease in Santa Fe County, New Mexico, Range 11 North, Range 11 West, T10N, R11W, S10E, New Mexico, 10, in such a manner as to permit production of gas from the Beverly Lodge Com Well No. 1, located in Santa Fe County, New Mexico, and from the Beverly Lodge Com Well No. 1, located in Santa Fe County, New Mexico.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, that applicant shall comply with all applicable laws and orders and shall be in accordance with the provisions of Rule 113-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that applicant shall file a copy of this order upon completion and annual thereafter.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That failure to comply with the provisions of this order shall be cause for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
