BRADENHEAD REPAIR PROCEDURE
MUDGE LS 45

February 8, 1994 (1st version)

THIS PROCEDURE SHOULD BE PERFORMED RIGLESS

1. Record FCP, and SIBHP.
2. RU lubricator and run in with guage ring to bottom.
3. Set an RBP at 2600'.
4. Pressure test casing and plug to 500 psig.
5. Run a GR/CBL from the RBP to the surface, determine TOC. If pressure test in step 4 failed, report to Paul Edwards at the Denver office and do not continue with procedure.
6. According to the well history, cement was circulated to surface during the primary cement job, therefore the cement top should be near the surface. Even more likely, the PC, Fruitland, and Ojo Alamo should be covered with cement. If the TOC is near the surface, as expected, then request permission from the NMOCD to pump cement down the bradenhead.
7. If a bradenhead squeeze is not acceptable, please contact Paul Edwards in Denver. Because the well is marginally economic, a full review of the situation between foreman, NMOCD, and engineering will be necessary before proceeding.
8. Remove RBP.
9. RU coiled tubing unit and TIH with 1" coiled tubing, clean out with nitrogen to PBTD (2935'), and land tubing at 2710'.
10. Tie well back into surface equipment and return to production.
