Gentlemen:

We are writing this letter to testify to the fact that the above well has been plugged back in such a manner to meet the Rules and Regulations of the New Nexico Oil Conservation Commission.

On June 20, 1957, Form G-103 was filed with the District #3 office of the Oil Conservation Commission. On this form it was stated that a 42° liner was set from 4785 to 6818 with cement circulated behind the liner.

After attempted completion in the Dakots formation which was unsuccessful, the well was killed and a Baker cast-iron bridge plug was set at 6019'. The well was then perforated in the Mesaverde formation from 4552 to 4773. The well was then sandwater-fracked and completed in this some. The well was shut-in for gauge on June 12, 1957. On June 30, 1957, a shut-in pressure was taken and an initial potential test was conducted by Mr. Virgil Stoabs, Farmington, New Mexico. Shut-in casing head pressure at that time was 1087# PSIG. We believe that this pressure indicates that the Mesaverde and Dakota formations have been successfully separated.

As the cement was circulated behind the $4\frac{1}{2}$ " liner, we feel that there will be little hazard of future co-mingling from corrosion of casing.
