OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A Aztec Oil & Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on September 8, 1966, for permission to dually complete its Culpepper Martin Well No. 4 located in Unit N of Section 28, Township 32 North, Range 12 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 28th day of September, 1966, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Aztec Oil & Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Culpepper Martin Well No. 4 located in Unit N of Section 28, Township 32 North, Range 12 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool through the casing-tubing annulus and the tubing respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter diring the Annual
