

THE APPLICATION OF AZTEC OIL AND
GAS COMPANY FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-2361

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Aztec Oil and Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on June 1, 1977, for permission to dually complete its Day State Well No. 1A located in Unit A of Section 32, Township 32 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit production of gas from the Blanco-Pictured Cliffs Pool and from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool.

Now, on this 21st day of June, 1977, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Aztec Oil and Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Day State Well No. 1A located in Unit A of Section 32, Township 32 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit production of gas from the Blanco-Pictured Cliffs Pool and from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation
Commission on June 1, 1977, for permission to dually complete
the Day State Well No. 1A located in Unit A of Section 22, Township
12 North, Range 11 West, WPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in
such a manner as to permit production of gas from the Blaine
Pictured Little Pool and from the Blaine-Messavada Pool.

On this 21st day of June, 1977, the Secretary-Director
finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions

- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that
all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and

non-treatable curative rights.
- (5) That the maintenance of the proposed dual completion is
feasible and consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Artco Oil and Gas Company, Inc.
and the name is hereby authorized to dually complete the Day State
Well No. 1A located in Unit A of Section 22, Township 12 North,
Range 11 West, WPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner
as to permit production of gas from the Blaine-Pictured Little
Pool and from the Blaine-Messavada Pool through a single
of casing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate,
and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule
112-A.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That applicant shall take such action as
may be necessary to comply with the provisions of said rule.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That satisfaction of this order
shall be a condition for the entry of such further orders as the
Commission may deem necessary.
