Gentlemen:

We have received a letter from Ralph A. Johnston indicating that your Company is now operator of the #1 Culpepper-Martin well in the SE 31-32-12. Our records do not indicate that any transfer has ever been effected. Will you please file Form C-110 showing that your Company is now operator of this well and the date of transfer.

On January 16, 1955 we notified Johnston & Johnston that we had never received form C-104, Request for Allowable and Gas Well Flat showing dedicated acreage or 1954 deliverability test on this well. We informed them that unless we had received these forms by February 1, 1955 we would be unable to place this well on the first production schedule, which will begin March 1, until such time as they have been filed.

If you are now operator on this well then we presume this will be your responsibility. It appears that it would be in your best interests to schedule this well for deliverability test at the earliest possible time so that a minimum of production will be lost.


