The log and the Notice of Intention to Plug the well drilled by you for the Lion Oil Company in Section 30, Township 20 North, Range 10 West, in McKinley County, has reached my office for approval, which I have done.

I am also enclosing copies of Form C-103, or Miscellaneous Reports on Wells, which you will please fill out and return to this office. This form, as you will note must be signed before a Notary Public. In the future it would be best to make out your Notice of Intention to Plug the well before the work is done. However, knowing that you have plugged as you proposed, I did approve your form C-102. Also, you are requested to furnish the location and logs of the test holes you are drilling in Township 21 North, Range 8 West.

The Commission realizes that you are drilling these test holes for geological information only, however, the rules and regulations of the Oil Conservation Commission require that any well drilled to a depth where you may penetrate an oil or gas bearing formation, the logs of the well must be furnished within thirty days after completion of the well. Therefore, after you have used the information gained from the drilling of these test wells you will please submit a plat showing the location and log of the wells drilled.
