Dear Sir:

We received Notice of Intention to Drill and Acreage Dedication Plat on your #4 Navajo "C" well located 1970 feet from the North Line and 1460 feet from the East Line of Section 4-30N-17W. I presume since you have dedicated 40 acres that this is primarily an oil prospect. This being the case, the well does not comply with the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission Rules and Regulations regarding spacing as it is not located the required distance from the 40-acre boundary.

New Mexico Rules require that an oil well be located no closer than 330 feet to the quarter-quarter section lines. Your well is located only 140 feet from the west line of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$ . Production on this well could not be approved without notice and hearing to show cause why the well could not be a standard location.

Will you please advise.

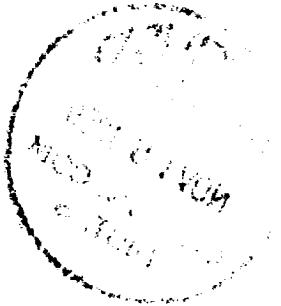
