The Oil Conservation Division (OCD) in New Mexico is in receipt of the 2017 Annual Groundwater Monitoring Report for the West Lovington Strawn Unit #8 with 1R-2457 identification. Data and site requests were made.

The following:

- 1. It is approved for monitor wells MW's 1 thru 6 for chloride evaluation using EPA Method 300.0 of site groundwater.
- 2. New monitor well identified as MW-7 should, if possible be moved an additional 60-80 feet to the southwest, if access allows.
- 3. OCD requires soil samples for chloride evaluation at 10 foot intervals to the air water interface, well defined log of soils and use of EPA 300.0 Method for analysis.
- 4. Add new well (MW-7) to sampling sequence for site when logistics allow.
- 5. Terracon schedule, sampling protocol and Methodologies for analysis are approved.
