Good morning, Olivia and Christina

Typically when a release gets reported to me by operations and it is classified as a "major" release, I'm usually in a time-crunch to get the release reported within the 24-hour deadline and I don't have a lot of time to double-check calculations and confirm with operations that the form they send to me is filled out accurately. For this particular release, one of our field techs was new in filling out our form and classified the release as a "leak", when in reality it was a blowdown, and the calculations were off. Before I submitted the C-141, I was able to confirm this with our tech, get the correct information, and revise the calculations for a blowdown. I hope this provides with you enough information for this discrepancy. Please let me know if you have any other questions or require additional information.

It was a pleasure meeting you both this morning. I'm emailing to notify you of two gas releases that occurred on Energy Transfer's Cal C Pipeline in Lea County, NM. The first gas release occurred on 9/7 with an approximate 3,107 Mcf release. The second gas release occurred on 9/8 with an approximate 5,986 Mcf release. Both of these releases were due to pipeline corrosion with repairs taking place. I will work on getting you the C-141s.
