DETAILS OF WORK

To 2935' anhydrite. Ran 2933.88' (9) 1/9 joints) of 5 1/2" to 14' SA 2-55 20' casing set at 2935' and cemented with 100 sacks regular cement. Mixed 15 sacks equagel with 70 barrel water and pumped ahead of cement. Plug was down at 8:30 A.M. 5-5-54. The 5/8" bit was on 2-55 casing was reclaimed. Cement was allowed to set 54 hours prior to testing casing shut off. The hole was balled try and no fluid entered the 5 1/2" casing during a 30 minute period and test was satisfactory. Drilling resumed.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
