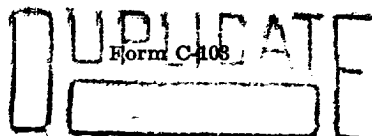

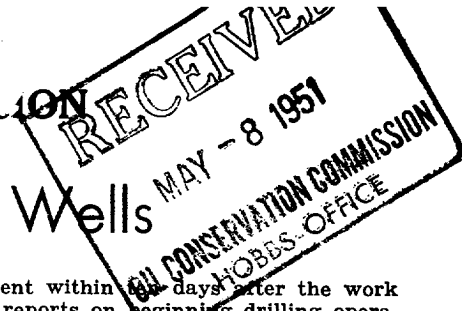

## DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

The cement around this 13 3/8" O. D. # 48 H-40 new casing circulated to the surface when the plug was pumped down to 165'. Plug was down at 11:10 P.M. 5-2-51.

On May 5, 1951, after cement had been drilled out to shoe joint, the casing was tested by applying 750# C.W.P. and holding it for 30 minutes. This was done between 2:30 A.M. and 3:00 A.M. 5-5-51. Pressure was applied by rig pumps.
