Re: Application for 160-acre Non-Standard Gas Production Unit, Eumont Gas Pool, Comprising W/2 and SE/4 of NE/4 and SE/4 of NW/4 of Section 8, T-20-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico

Gentlemen:

Gulf Oil Corporation hereby makes application for approval of a Non-Standard Gas Production Unit comprising the W/2 and SE/4 of NE/4 and SE/4 of NW/4 of Section 8, T-20-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico and in support thereof states the following facts:

- (1) Gulf Oil Corporation is owner and operator of a 160-acre oil and gas lease known as its Bertie Whitacre Lease, Lea County, New Mexico, as shown on the attached plat.
- (2) Gulf Oil Corporation proposes that the above described acreage be established as a Non-Standard 160-Acre Gas Production Unit in exception to Rule 5(a) of Order R-520.
- (3) The Bertie Whitacre Well No. 2, located 660' from the North line and 1,980' from the East line of Section 8, T-20-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico, was completed in the Eumont Gas Pool on January 13, 1956. The applicant proposes to use this well as the unit well.
- (4) Gulf Oil Corporation and Cities Service Oil Company are contemplating the formation of a 200-Acre Non-Standard Gas Production Unit which would include 40 acres of Cities Service's Laughlin Lease described as the NE/4 NE/4 Section 8, T-20-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico. The Commission's rules do not permit administrative approval of the dedication of the 160 acres covered by this application plus the 40 acres owned by Cities Service, therefore it is the intent of Gulf to obtain administrative approval of the 160-acre unit covered by this application. Then on completion of negotiations between Gulf and Cities Service, an application for a hearing before the Commission on the formation of the 200-acre unit will be filed.

Gentlemen:

Gulf Oil Corporation hereby makes application for approval of a Non-Standard Gas Production Unit containing 1/2 and 3/4 of W/4 and SW/4 of NE/4 of Section 8, T-2S, R-37E, Las Comas, New Mexico and in support thereof states the following facts:

- (1) Gulf Oil Corporation is owner and operator of a 100-acre oil and gas lease known as the Bartie Unit Lease, Las Comas, New Mexico, as a one on the attached plat.
- (2) Gulf Oil Corporation proposes that the above described acreage be established as a Non-Standard 100-acre Gas Production Unit in exception to Rule 5(a) of Order R-120.
- (3) The Bartie Unit Lease No. 1, located 100' from the North line and 1,980' from the East line of Section 8, T-2S, R-37E, Las Comas, New Mexico, was completed in the front gas pool on January 12, 1954. The production of gas from this well as the well.
- (4) Gulf Oil Corporation and Cities Service Oil Company are continuing the formation of a 200-acre Non-Standard Gas Production Unit which would include a number of Cities Service's land lease recorded as the W/4 and SW/4 of NE/4 of Section 8, T-2S, R-37E, Las Comas, New Mexico. The Commission's rules do not permit administrative approval of the production of the 100 acres covered by this application plus the 100 acres owned by Cities Service, before it is the intent of this administrative approval of the 100-acre unit covered by this application. Thus on completion of negotiations between Gulf and Cities Service, an application for a leasehold before the Commission on the formation of the 200-acre unit will be filed.
