That if this well is productive, then the Jalmat Gas Pool should be extended to include at least the NW/4 of Section 13, T-22S, R-35E by the Commission's own motion at a future hearing. That a 320 acre unit should be assigned this well if it is productive.

(e) That the entire non-standard proration unit may be reasonably presumed to be productive of gas. That this non-standard proration unit is offset by only one other producer from the Yates formation which is the J. R. Cone Nix-State No. 1 in the same section. That when this well is completed as a gas producer, this step out well will prove without a doubt that our entire 320-acre lease and non-standard proration is gas productive.

(f) That by copy of this letter by registered mail, The Texas Company is requesting a waiver from the only offset operator, J. R. Cone, under both Paragraph 5 (a) and (b) of Rule 5(b) of Order R-520. That offset operator is being notified and requested to send one executed copy of the waiver to you and return one copy of the waiver to The Texas Company.

This application is to form a 320-acre non-standard gas proration unit around The Texas Company's proposed State of New Mexico "BZ" (NCT-1) Well No. 1 to consist of the N/2 of Section 13, T-22S, R-35E, Lea County, New Mexico. The Texas Company, therefore, requests the Oil Conservation Commission to grant an administrative non-standard proration order under Rule 5(b) of Order R-520 as soon as the waiver is received from J. R. Cone.
