Cemented 9-5/8" casing from 1408' to cellar with 500 sack cement stopping plug at 1390', and then permitted cement to set around the pipe. After cement had set, the plug was drilled, 11-27-34, and hole bailed dry and left open for a 12 hour period, after which hole tested dry and drilling operations were resumed.

MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS ON WELLS

The following reports were received from the several counties during the year ending June 30, 1907, and are herewith published for the information of the public. The reports are arranged in alphabetical order of the counties from which they were received.

Albany County. The following wells were reported to have been drilled during the year ending June 30, 1907:

1. Drilled by J. H. Smith, at the farm of J. H. Smith, near the village of Rotterdam, for the purpose of obtaining water for domestic use. The well was drilled to a depth of 150 feet and yielded a quantity of water sufficient for the needs of the household.

2. Drilled by W. J. Brown, at the farm of W. J. Brown, near the village of Rotterdam, for the purpose of obtaining water for domestic use. The well was drilled to a depth of 120 feet and yielded a quantity of water sufficient for the needs of the household.

3. Drilled by R. L. Green, at the farm of R. L. Green, near the village of Rotterdam, for the purpose of obtaining water for domestic use. The well was drilled to a depth of 100 feet and yielded a quantity of water sufficient for the needs of the household.

4. Drilled by T. M. White, at the farm of T. M. White, near the village of Rotterdam, for the purpose of obtaining water for domestic use. The well was drilled to a depth of 80 feet and yielded a quantity of water sufficient for the needs of the household.

5. Drilled by C. D. Black, at the farm of C. D. Black, near the village of Rotterdam, for the purpose of obtaining water for domestic use. The well was drilled to a depth of 60 feet and yielded a quantity of water sufficient for the needs of the household.

6. Drilled by F. G. Gray, at the farm of F. G. Gray, near the village of Rotterdam, for the purpose of obtaining water for domestic use. The well was drilled to a depth of 40 feet and yielded a quantity of water sufficient for the needs of the household.

7. Drilled by H. J. King, at the farm of H. J. King, near the village of Rotterdam, for the purpose of obtaining water for domestic use. The well was drilled to a depth of 20 feet and yielded a quantity of water sufficient for the needs of the household.
