**Gentlemen:**

**We have your letter of September 27, 1962, requesting administrative approval of a 120-acre non-standard proration unit consisting of the S/2 NW/4, NW/4 NW/4 of Section 14, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico.**

**Please be advised that the Commission is unable to grant this application immediately as the General Rules and Regulations for Southeast New Mexico require the Commission to wait 30 days after all offset operators owning interests within 1500 feet of the well have been notified by registered mail of the intent to form the non-standard gas proration unit. The Commission therefore will temporarily assign an allowable for the oil well located in the NE/4 NW/4 of Section 14, and will grant the application if no objections are received from offset operators within the required 30-day waiting period.**

**Also please be advised that the Commission tentatively plans to make the non-standard proration order retroactive to the date the allowable was assigned to the oil well. It appears from your application that you have notified Shell Oil Company and The Atlantic Refining Company of the request for the above 120-acre non-standard gas proration unit;**

The Commission has received information from the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management, that the Bureau is currently conducting a study of the feasibility of establishing a National System of Public Lands. The Commission is interested in this study and would like to receive a report on the results of the study.

1. The first step in the process of setting up a  
 2. financial institution is to determine the type of  
 3. institution to be established. This may be a  
 4. bank, a savings and loan association, or a  
 5. credit union. Each type of institution has  
 6. its own set of regulations and requirements.  
 7. The next step is to obtain the necessary  
 8. capital. This can be done by raising funds  
 9. from investors or by borrowing from a bank.  
 10. Once the capital is in place, the institution  
 11. can begin to operate. This involves hiring  
 12. staff, opening branches, and providing  
 13. services to customers. The institution must  
 14. also comply with all applicable laws and  
 15. regulations.

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therefore, the Commission will be able to enter the non-standard proration order on October 31, 1962, if no objections are received.

If there are other offset operators who have not received notice, please notify them and advise us.
