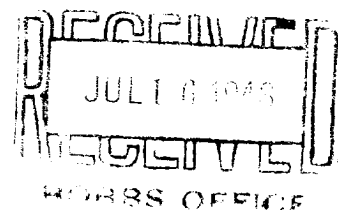

Cemented with 1500 sacks Atlas Bulk Cement - first 1000 sacks mixed 3% Howcogel - and 50 sacks Incor Cement and plug pumped to 2673' at 9:00PM, 7-9-48.
