Dear Mr. Spurrier:

Comes now Thompson & Cone who respectfully requests an exception to Rule 3, Order No. R-368-A, Jaleco Gas Pool Rules; and, the granting of an unorthodox location for their Stanolind-Meyers Well No. 1 located 1650 feet from the North line and 330 feet from the East line of Section 22, T-24-S, R-36-E, NMPM.

For the purpose of establishing a proration unit for the well, Thompson & Cone have dedicated all of the Northeast quarter (being 160 acres, more or less) of Section 22, T-24-S, R-36-E, NMPM to the well.

The initial objective of the aforesaid well was the Seven Rivers formation which is productive of oil on offsetting leases. However, extensive testing demonstrated the Seven Rivers to be entirely water-bearing in the Stanolind-Meyers No. 1. The casing then was bridged at 3380 feet and jet perforated opposite the Yates formation from 3250 feet to 3360 feet. Following a 5000-gallon sand-oil treatment through these perforations, the well earned an open flow potential on March 1, 1954 of 4,200 MCF of gas per day. The well now stands shut in pending connection by El Paso Natural Gas Company who has contracted to purchase the gas from the well.

The attached plat shows the location of Thompson & Cone Stanolind-Meyers No. 1 and all offset operators to the Northeast quarter of Section 22, T-24-S, R-36-E, NMPM. There are no other producing gas wells within the area of the plat.

The petitioner has submitted a copy of this application and plat to the following operators: Continental Oil Company, Kan-Mex Corporation, Magnolia Petroleum Company, R. Olsen Oil Company, Phillips Petroleum Company, and Stanolind Oil and Gas Company; and, to the Conservation Commission office in Hobbs, New Mexico.

Dear Sir:

Reference is made to your letter of May 17, 1984.

Somehow you have been advised that the gas well located on the north line and 333 feet from the East line of Section 22, T-34-S, R-38-E, Albany County, New York, is a gas well. This is not correct. The well is a water well and is not producing gas.

For the purpose of establishing a protective well for the well, you have indicated all of the northeast quarter (being 180 feet wide and 333 feet long) of Section 22, T-34-S, R-38-E, Albany County, New York, to be the well.

The initial objective of the proposed well is the seven acres located on the northeast quarter of Section 22, T-34-S, R-38-E, Albany County, New York, which is producing oil on an offsetting lease. However, extensive testing conducted by the seven-acre lease operator, the Gas Well-Service Co., Inc., has shown that the gas well is not producing gas. The gas well is a water well and is not producing gas. The well is located on the north line and 333 feet from the East line of Section 22, T-34-S, R-38-E, Albany County, New York.

The attached plat shows the location of the seven-acre lease on the northeast quarter of Section 22, T-34-S, R-38-E, Albany County, New York, and all other operators to the northeast quarter of Section 22, T-34-S, R-38-E, Albany County, New York. There are no other producing gas wells within the area of the plat.

The petitioner has submitted a copy of this notification and plat to the following operators: Continental Oil Company, Ken-Mex Corporation, Republic Petroleum Company, W. Olsen Oil Company, Phillips Petroleum Company, and the Conservation Commission; and to the Conservation Commission office in Albany, New York.
