

Dear Mr. Sandager:

In response to your letter of March 15, 1971, I wish to inform you that the dismissal of Case 4220 by the Commission did not exonerate the bond of your company as to the E. P. Campbell Christmas Well No. 1. The Commission merely dismissed the plugging case as it was advised there was no immediate need to cause the well to be plugged.

Our records show that all three of the wells mentioned in your letter are covered by the one \$10,000 Blanket Bond described above, that the name of the operator of the three wells has not been changed, and that no new bond has been issued covering the three wells. Our records do show that the bond was cancelled October 21, 1961, as to liability for any wells acquired by the operator after that date.

Please refer to Case Number 4220 concerning the E. P. Campbell Christmas Well # 1. You wrote us on October 24, 1969 and on November 13, 1969 we received a copy of the Order of the Commission wherein Case 4220 was dismissed. Would you explain whether or not this dismissal is an exoneration of the bond our company had on this well? It is possible that your records will show that a new bond has now been written to cover this particular well and perhaps a new name is listed as the owner. If you could tell us this, we would greatly appreciate it.

We are also interested in two other wells, namely, the Whitton Well and the Cockersham Well because we did have plugging bonds on these wells. Could you tell us the names of the new owners on these two wells and the name or names of the present bonding company. Do your records show that our company does not have any bonds covering these last two wells? If you need further identification of the Cockersham Well is 1-A 34-18S-26E and the Whitton Well is 1-N 33-23S-36E.

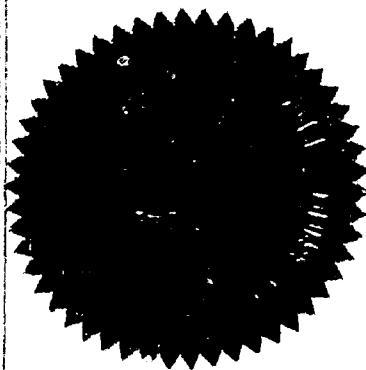
