ORDER OF THE DIVISION

BY THE DIVISION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on October 21, 1981, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Richard L. Stamets.

NOW, on this 18th day of November, 1981, the Division Director, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Division has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Sam H. Snoddy, seeks approval of an unorthodox gas well location 660 feet from the North line and 660 feet from the East line of Section 26, Township 20 South, Range 32 East, Oil-Potash Area, NMPM, to test the Pennsylvanian formation, Lea County, New Mexico.
- (3) That the N/2 of said Section 26 is to be dedicated to the well.
- (4) That a well at said unorthodox location will better enable applicant to produce the gas underlying the proration unit and will permit the well to be located more distant from a gas pipeline.
- (5) That no offset operator objected to the proposed unorthodox location.

-2-Case No. 7392 Order No. R-6834

(6) That approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the gas in the subject pool, will prevent the economic loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, avoid the augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells, and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- (1) That the application of Sam H. Snoddy for an unorthodox gas well location for the Pennsylvanian formation is hereby approved for a well to be located at a point 660 feet from the North line and 660 feet from the East line of Section 26, Township 20 South, Range 32 East, NMPM, Oil-Potash Area, Lea County, New Mexico.
- (2) That the N/2 of said Section 26 shall be dedicated to the above-described well.
- (3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.

Me have --- Mr. Snoddy has staked a location, a standard location on the acreage which we have as a farmout from Felmont Oil Company, as well as have an interest in the lease ourselves, and this standard location of 660 from the north, 1980 from the east line of Section 26, 20 South, 32 East, falls right on a pipeline, Cas Company of New Mexico pipeline. In fact it's five feet from the line.

Q And as a consequence of that you filed this application?

A. That is correct.

Is this application for a non-standard

Q And is it also located in the potash

Yes, it is.

All right. Now, refer to what has been marked as Snoddy Exhibit Number One, if you would, please, Mr. Whitten, and explain that.

A. This is a well location and acreage dedication plat showing the location that was staked, standard location that was staked, and it describes the Gas Company of New Mexico pipeline crossing the location. There's also

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a pipeline to the Kerr McGee plant in blue. I don't know what kind of pipeline that is but I was out on the site and it definitely interferes with that location, or does cross the location, the pad.

So we definitely, it's because of topographical reasons we definitely have to select another site.

Q. Well, now, Exhibit Number One is actually the C-102 which you would have filed originally.

- A. That's correct.
- Q And that is the orthodox location.
- A. Right.

We have three dry holes to the north of us, at least dry in the Penn, the objective Penn formation, the David Faskins No. 1 Baetz, B-A-E-T-Z, was drilled in Section 23 to the north; was tested in the Penn and found to be uncommercial and plugged back to a Bone Springs completion. In Section 14 the Belco No. 1 "TL" has just recently

this map, a standard location running the proration unit as having the entire east half as the proration unit this 1980 from the north line would run it down into the measurable ore area, so we didn't -- we couldn't file an orthodox location there because of the potasn.

Q Was the original of this map and this letter received by you in the ordinary course of business?

A. Yes, it was.

Now, would you now refer to what has been marked as Exhibit Number Four, please, Mr. Whitten, and would you discuss the map and explain it?

A. Yes. This is a structure map prepared by me on top of the Morrow limestone and shows a map in the area of Salt Lake South Field and this referred to acreage.

We anticipate the possibility that it

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would be -- or the location could be located actually further west than it is, but we would request that it be located 660 from the north and east lines because we want to obtain a higher structural position in this area.

Now, the -- if you'll note, the Faskin Baetz Well, which is in Section 23, the Flag Redfern Well in Section 13, are both lower structurally. Also note that in Section 25 the Grace No. 2 relmont reional is relatively low. 
