

I am returning herewith a letter from Mr. J. W. House together with proposed form to replace New Mexico Conservation Commission Form C-108 and Form C-109.

While Mr. Dewey's letter does not so state, I would infer that a separate form is to be made for each lease as the proposed form would not accumodate several lezzes. If it is proposed that a separate report be filed only for each field, it would appear that it would be necessary to provide a column in the report for the name of the lease, state land number,

The term "Net Oil Sold" is undoubtedly a misnomer as it would appear that the figure which should be furnished to the Commission and used by them is not "Oll Sold" but "Oil Rum From The Lease". This is equally true with respect to the column headed "Purchaser" on the proposed report which should parkage be changed to read "Pipe Line Connected". In the case of leases served by the Texas-New Mexico Pipe Line Company, I believe that the Sinclair or Tidewater is in many instances the purchaser. In so far as Euroble Oil & Refining Company leases connected by Euroble Pipe Line Company are concerned, the oil as you know is not sold at the lease but is nevely transported for account of the Humble Gil & Refining Company and is sold upon delivery by Eurole Pipe Line Congany at seaboard terminele.

In the discussion with the New Mexico Cil & Gas Association Committee in regard to this form as well as other forms required by the Conservation Cormission, we have endeavored to persuade the Cormission to eliminate from the reports data as to the total gas produced from oil wells having in mind the situation which has developed in Louisiana with respect to taxation on gas produced but not used. While we appreciate that information with respect to gaz-oil ratio is necessary to the proper enforcement of Conservation regulations, it has been the view of the Corrittee that the essential information of this nature could best be secured from periodic reports of tests on wells rather than sttempting to work out and compile all of the details of this nature each month.

The form does not carry instructions in regard to the preparation and filling of this preparation, and I would also suggest that any instructions which are to be written in commention with it provide that a copy of the report be furnished to the gipe line cerving the lease each month.

and critician. We have but one objection to this form and that is, under the unit basis report in column (1) "Net Oil Sold", that this particular column represents at best an estimate of the net oil sold by any producer who produces oil into a central tank battery.

While it is true in the same circumstances that not oil produced by each well is to some degree an estimate, sitll the amount of oil produced by each well can be more nearly estimated by following production tests, while the net oil sold must be estimated from common tankage and all the laws regarding oil in common tankage specifically declare that it is impossible to segregrate such oil as to its producing units.

The rest of the form meets with our approval. We are anxious that these forms be printed and distributed as soon as possible in order that the old Form C-108 and C-109 may be displaced.



This comes as a great surprise as a question from a member of an organization which includes such thinkers as Suman, Moore and Schultius. I doubt whether a New Mexico country boy can give a deficition nearly as satisfactory as could any of these, nor do I believe that you seriously question what is usually meant by waste as the term is used in the industry.

Homover, we much to charify my own thoughts as to answer your question, I will attempt to define the word as I believe it is used now in the industry. What is avoidable loss in which to production of oil and

gos, using the most efficient production methods and techniques now known and economically available and feasible. In Now Nextoo law, whete is definitely defined as including, together with its usual meanings, underground waste, surface waste, and production in excess of reasonable market demand.

Come confusion has arisen recently because of people who imply on using "evoidable yeste" and "unavoidable waste". I believe this is in error in learnings. That the intend to say is "swordhable loss" and unavoidable loss", as the word loss is usually used in science. Avoidable loss then becomes waste. I believe that the economic phase must be included, because it is not prectical or feasible to expend more money in eliminating some parts of waste than no get in return, and I also believe that what we consider waste must be predicated on our present knowledge and methods and not on some hoped for future improvements or increased understanding of the problems involved.

We have your letter of recent date directed to all Operators in Lea & Eddy Counties, reference to combining Form: G-108 and C-109, and have examined the sample form. We are heartly in scoord with the proposal, and

believe that the Conservation Commission should be petitioned to adopt same. In reply to your request for suggestions, etc., we offer the following: Under oil dispositions, that "Bbls to or from stock tanks", and "Met Production" be smitted, and spaces be provided for Opening and Closing Stocks. The correctness of the "Net oil produced" figure could then be computed on the face of the form by adding closing stock to Net oil sold and subtracting opening stock. It seems that calculating "Bbis to or from stock tanks" with seles of oil, to equal not production, is starting off with the essumption that the net production figure is correct; whereas, by starting off with opening and closing stocks, we need only to know what the net sales figure is, to determine the correct net production.

The elimination of the "Net production" line in the lower part of the form will not take enything away from the form, since "net production" is already taken care of in the upper part.

Having attended most of the recent meetings in connection with reporting forms in New Mexico, we realize how extremely difficult it is to prepare forms entirely pleasing to everyone in all respects, and with this in mind we wish to state that if our above suggestion meets with any particular disapproval, we beg to waive it, and urge the adoption of the form as it is, since we believe the requirement that both Forms C-108 and C-109 be filed each month is an unjust burden on operators, and especially so, since these two forms ere duplications in some respects.

So far as this company is concerned, the form meets with our approval, except that there are one or two suggestions that I am making below for what they may be worth to you. Please understand that the form as prepared is satisfactory with us, however, our operations are very limited in New Mexico, and it is possible that the comments below would affect the larger operators to a much greater extent than in our case.

It seems to me that there is some information requested on the form that is almost impossible to accurately give. It may be that that information is necessary, and if so, of course, it would have to be included. I have reference to the Gravity of the Oil; the Total Gas Production M.C.F.; Gas-Oil Ratio cu. ft. per Barrel and Gallons per M.C.F. Particularly, is the gas production difficult to accurately report, because there is no way of metering it, and of course, leases in most instances are not provided with meters.

The gas-oil ratio cannot be determined accurately except by tests, and these tests are seldom, if ever, made on the average producing property.

The gallons per thousand cubic feet is, of course, unknown to the operator unless he is disposing of his gas to some casing

On the bottom of the form the information concerning the gas is practically impossible to estimate on the average lease. I know, for our part, that any figure we might show would be just a wild guess, because we have no means of measuring the gas and would be put to a considerable expense were that necessary. As I have said before, these suggestions are made for what they may be worth, and I hope that they are considered by you as not critical.

I believe everyone will be satisfied with the new form provided the old form C-108 is eliminated and the time of submitting the form is made at such a date that pipe line statements are received before the report has to be sent in. If the time for submitting the new Form C-109 is the same as the present Form C-109, namely, the 25th of the month, I think it will work quite satisfactorily.

I believe the Conservation Commission should be petitioned by the Les County Operators Committee to adopt the new form.

We submit to you herewith our Producer's Monthly Crude Petroleum Oil Report for the month of November 1941, on Form C-108. We also enclose Operator's Monthly Report for November on Form C-109.

Report on Form C-108 being due December 15th is delinquent due to the fact that the information called for on the form, namely, oil runs to pipe line, does not reach this office until after the 15th, sometimes as late as the Elst. We can make out this information from our current production records but invariably some of these are in error due to the fact that the pipe line companies many times make changes on the run tickets, notice of which we do not get until we receive the monthly pipe line statements. As before stated, these do not reach us until after the 15th, sometimes stated, these do not reach us until after the 15th, sometimes as late as the 21st. In order to make an accurate report it is necessary to have the pipe line statements. We believe the time of submitting form C-108 should be about the 25th of the month.

On the other hand you require form C-108 to be submitted by the 25th of the month. The pertinent information desired on this form (excepting pipe line runs, which is a duplication of information on form C-108), is that of the physical condition of the wells. We believe that is the purpose of this form. This information can be had soon after the first of the month and it is not necessary to delay it until the 25th. We believe the times for submitting the forms are reversed. It would be better, however, to have both forms due at the same time.

Hay we take the liberty to make exception to Form C-108. This form is a good one for the purpose it is intended but you require another purpose for it. It seems the form is almost identical with the Federal Tender Board form. The

Federal Tander Board form is designed to submit information by pools and to that end is a good form. But when you require the information to be submitted by leases on this form it does not serve the purpose very well. The form was not designed for this. Sections 1 and 2 of the form each have a line for totals. We are at a loss as to what to do with these lines. We cannot add up lease names, unit letters, counties, names of transporters or locations of tanks on these lines. And to add up the numbers on lease tanks has no meaning except a repetition of the lines above in the column. In Section 8 of the same form there is no provision to take care of wells separately, yet a line total is given implying that information for separate wells should be given. After the oil is produced into the tanks there is no way of telling how much from each well goes to the pipe line. The only way we can submit information for each well on this form would be to have a separate tank for each well and pipe line runs made from each well tank.

It is our information that at the time the new forms were considered that they were to be designed to aid the operators in making reports in conjunction with the required Tender Board form. Form C-108 was apparently adopted for that purpose. But to that purpose it has failed completely, for instead of relieving the deuplication of labor
in making the reports the new forms have doubled and almost
tripled the work. The reason being that the Tender Board
form calls for information by pools and you require the information by separate leases. The two forms, Federal and
State, cannot be made at the same time in a typewriter and
