TRANSCRIPT OF EXAMINER HEARING

1 MR. STAMETS: The Hearing will come to order, please.

2 We will call next Case 5105.

3 MR. DERRYBERRY: Case 5105, application of  
4 Stallworth Oil and Gas for an unorthodox oil well  
5 location, Lea County, New Mexico.

6 MR. STAMETS: Call for appearances in Case 5105.

7 MR. STEVENS: Mr. Examiner, Don Stevens. I'm an  
8 attorney in Santa Fe, representing the Applicant in  
9 this case. We have one witness to be sworn.

10 MR. STAMETS: Any other appearances in this case?  
11 The witness stand and be sworn, please.

12 CONRAD R. APPLIEDORN,  
13 a witness, having been first duly sworn according to law;  
14 upon his oath testified as follows:

15 DIRECT EXAMINATION

16 BY MR. STEVENS:

17 Q Would you state your name, your address, and your  
18 occupation?

19 A My name is Conrad R. Appledorn. I'm a Petroleum  
20 Engineer, and I'm from Santa Fe.

21 Q Are you representing the Applicant?

22 A I'm representing the Applicant in this case.

23 Q Have you previously testified before the New Mexico  
24 Oil Conservation Commission and had your qualifications  
25 accepted by it?

1 A I have.

2 MR. STEVENS: Are the witness' qualifications  
3 acceptable?

4 MR. STAMETS: They are.

5 Q Briefly would you explain what the Applicant seeks  
6 in this application?

7 A The Applicant wishes to drill a well at an unorthodox  
8 location in Section 11 of Township 9 South, Range 33  
9 East, Lea County, New Mexico.

10 Q What is that exact footage location in Section 11?

11 A The footage is 760 feet from the North line and 860  
12 feet from the West line of Section 11; and this is  
13 unorthodox in that field rules in the Vada-Penn Field  
14 require location within 150 feet of the center of a  
15 quarter-quarter section which is a 660-foot location.

16 Therefore, this location, the proposed location,  
17 is unorthodox to the extent that it is 50 feet in excess  
18 of field rules from the West line.

19 Q That is, it's 50 feet farther East than would ordinarily  
20 be permitted; is that correct?

21 A Yes. That's right.

22 Q Well, first let's go into the structure, Exhibit Number 1,  
23 the structure map. Could you explain it for the  
24 Commission?

25 A Exhibit Number 1 is a structure map on the Bough "C"

1 producing horizon in the Pennsylvanian in the Northwest  
2 Vada area.

3 The location is shown by the arrow and is on the  
4 Southeast flank of a Northeasterly, trending Northeast.

5 Q Excuse me. What's the significance of your yellow  
6 outline there?

7 A The yellow outline is Stallworth acreage which shows  
8 that the subject location is bordered to the North  
9 and West by Stallworth-owned acreage.

10 Also, it shows the proposed acreage that will be  
11 dedicated to the well which is the Northwest quarter  
12 of Section 11.

13 Q On the basis of this structure map, is there any  
14 advantage or disadvantage of the proposed location  
15 over a standard location to your knowledge?

16 A None at all. Actually, there is no structural  
17 advantage to be gained within this 50-foot exception.

18 Q Referring to what has been marked as Exhibit Number 2,  
19 would you explain it for the Commission?

20 A Exhibit Number 2 is an Isopachus Map of the net porosity  
21 within the Bough "C" producing interval. The zone of  
22 inferred maximum porosity development is marked; and if  
23 you will refer to Exhibit 1 again, you can see that the  
24 zone of development seems to correspond roughly to this  
25 Northerly trending Northeast and anti-clinal development

1 in the Bough "C".

2 We have no definite geologic advantage to this  
3 location being in the unorthodox location as against  
4 a standard location.

5 However, the location is being sited to take  
6 advantage of a drilling pad which was made for the  
7 Burleson & Huff State Number 1 drilling in 1961; and  
8 the Stallworth well has been located 100 feet East  
9 and South of the Burleson & Huff Well.

10 This places the well at roughly the Southeastern  
11 corner of the Burleson & Huff pad, allows use of the  
12 old pit area and a very minimum of new location  
13 development in this area.

14 Q Does that also amount to a lesser amount of roads  
15 being built?

16 A Well, the old road will be used. So there will be no  
17 new road built for this location. The only additional  
18 location work will be slight extending to the pad to  
19 the South and East to allow for laying down the derik  
20 and for pipe racks on the South side.

21 Q What advantage do the Applicants gain from this use  
22 of this pad?

23 A It's mainly topographic in that this is relatively flat  
24 area. It has a rather thick surface which in times of  
25 rain is, gets pretty bad, very deep, much rutting.

1 Therefore, any use that we can make of the old roads  
2 in the old pad area will reduce by a large degree  
3 additional damage to this range-land area which is  
4 susceptible to damage.

5 Q Does that also make the drilling of the well more  
6 economical for the Applicant?

7 A It makes the drilling much more economical. It makes  
8 general operations much easier, and it also reduces  
9 damages from the pits which will take advantage of the  
10 old pit area.

11 Q Referring to your Exhibit Number 2, you stated this is  
12 an inferred maximum porosity development. On that  
13 basis, this location being farther East than the  
14 regular location, would that be going away from the  
15 inferred zone of maximum porosity development?

16 A Well, the distance of 100 or 200 feet East of the old  
17 660 standard location wouldn't be sufficient. This  
18 zone of maximum porosity development is merely inferred  
19 because of the three wells to the North which are  
20 producers and the Coastal State Well to the Southwest  
21 which has produced but now has been plugged. The  
22 Flying M Well in Section 15 is an Abo Well and is not  
23 in the Bough "C".

24 Q In any case, going this 50 feet East would in your  
25 opinion not gain you a greater amount of porosity



1 development than the regular location; would it?

2 A I don't believe so. I think the location is within  
3 the normal elements of error in any type of geologic  
4 projection. The main advantage is the location of the  
5 old pad and the use that can be made of it, and therefore  
6 making the well more economical.

7 Also, the fact that because of the acreage  
8 situation, correlative rights are not or will not be  
9 damaged; and, of course, the more economical location  
10 is quite desirable in this Bough "C" development which  
11 tends to be rather chancy.

12 Q In your opinion, is the entire proration unit productive  
13 of oil and gas?

14 A In my opinion, yes, the entire proration unit would  
15 be productive.

16 Q In your opinion, will granting of this application  
17 protect correlative rights and tend to prevent waste?

18 A Yes.

19 Q Were Exhibits 1 and 2 prepared by you?

20 A These Exhibits were prepared by me, yes.

21 MR. STEVENS: At this time we'd like to introduce  
22 into evidence Exhibits 1 and 2 of the Applicant's.

23 MR. STAMETS: They will be so-admitted.

24 MR. STEVENS: We have no further questions, Mr.

25 Examiner.

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on November 14, 1973, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Richard L. Stamets.

NOW, on this 20th day of November, 1973, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That the applicant, Stallworth Oil and Gas, seeks approval for an unorthodox oil well location for a well to be drilled at a point 760 feet from the North line and 860 feet from the West line of Section 11, Township 9 South, Range 33 East, NMPM, Vada-Pennsylvanian Pool, Lea County, New Mexico, as an exception to the provisions of Rule 4 of Order No. R-3179-A.

(3) That the NW/4 of said Section 11 is to be dedicated to the well.

(4) That the proposed non-standard location is sought in order to take advantage of an existing roadway and caliche pad previously constructed in connection with the drilling of a shallow well nearby.

(5) That the applicant will not gain any significant structural or stratigraphic advantage as a result of the proposed unorthodox location.

(6) That the applicant is the owner of all mineral interests directly offsetting the proposed unorthodox location.

(7) That approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce his just and equitable share of the oil in the Vada-Pennsylvanian pool, prevent economic waste and protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That the applicant, Stallworth Oil and Gas, is hereby authorized to drill a well in an unorthodox location at a point 760 feet from the North line and 860 feet from the West line of Section 11, Township 9 South, Range 33 East, NMPM, Vada-Pennsylvanian Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.

(2) That the NW/4 of said Section 11 shall be dedicated to the well.

(3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

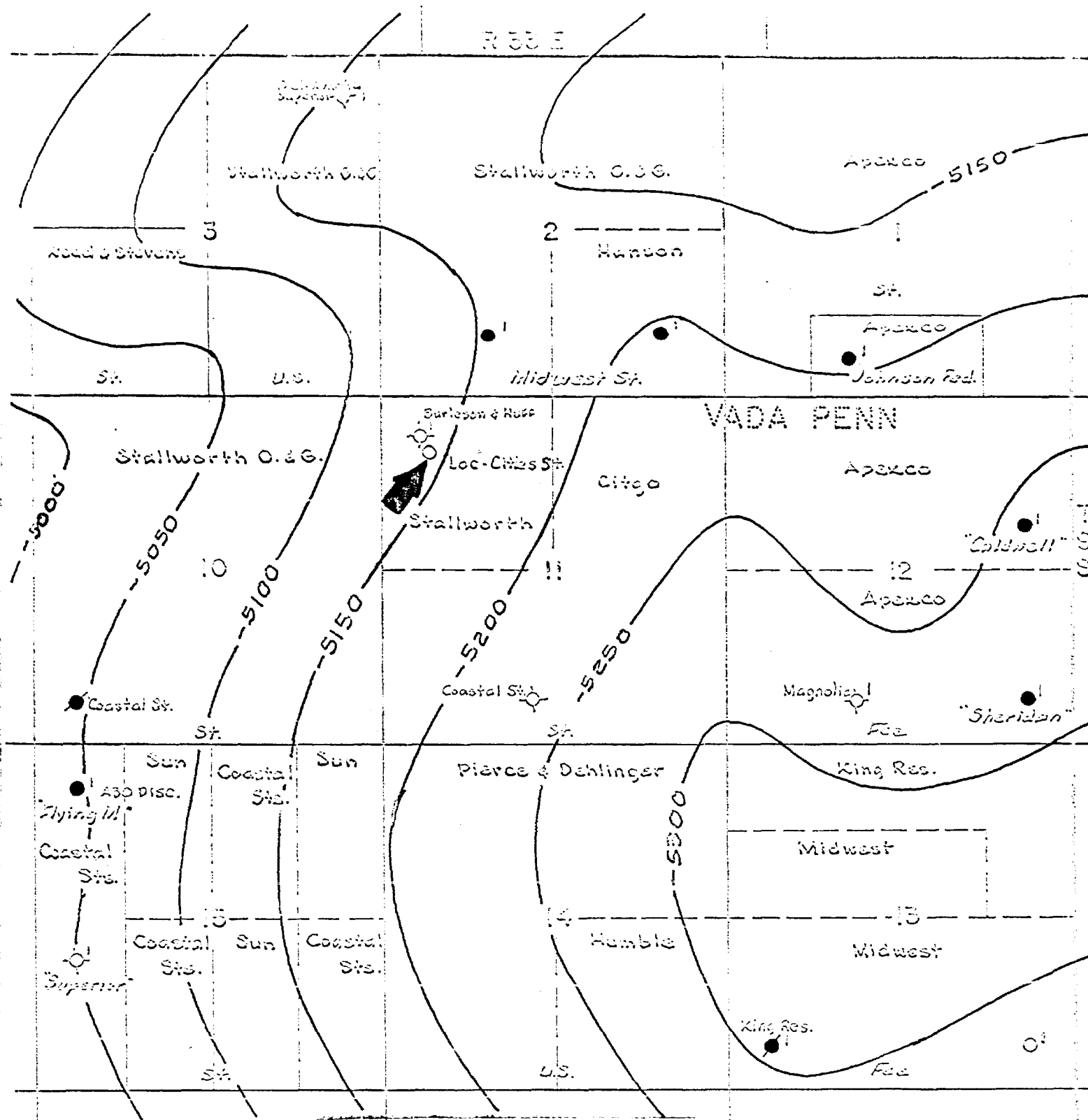

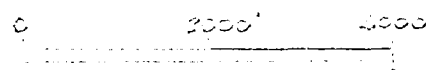

Comes now Stallworth Oil and Gas and applies to the Oil Conservation Commission of the State of New Mexico for the approval of an unorthodox oil well location to be located 760 feet from the North line and 860 feet from the West line of Section 11, Township 9 South, Range 33 East Lea County, New Mexico, as an exception to the provisions of Rule 4 of Order No. R-3179-A, as amended, and in support thereof would show the Commission:

1. Applicant is the owner of the right to drill for, develop and produce from the Pennsylvanian formation in the Northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 11, above Township and Range.
2. Applicant seeks approval of an unorthodox oil well location as proposed herein in order to take advantage of an existing roadway and caliche pad used in the drilling of a shallow well nearby.
3. Approval of the application will result in a lesser destruction of grazing lands and decreased well costs. Approval would cause no waste, and correlative rights of the other owners in the area would not be affected.

(1) That the applicant, Stallworth Oil and Gas is hereby authorized to drill a well in an unorthodox location at a point 760 feet from the North line and 860 feet from the West line of Section 11, Township 9 South, Range 33 East, NMPM, Vada-Pennsylvanian Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.

(2) That the <sup>NW 1/4</sup> ~~NE 1/4~~ of said Section 11 shall be dedicated to the well.

(3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
