We have one witness, Mr. Holder and I would like to have him sworn.

(Witness sworn.)

A. C. HOLDER

called as a witness, having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. HINKLE:

- Q State your name and your residence.
- A My name is A. C. Holder and I live at 3 West Avenue H in Lovington, New Mexico.
- Q Are you president of the Silver Monument Minerals, Inc., the Applicant in this case?
 - A I am.
- Q I might state this that Mr. Holder is not a geologist or a petroleum engineer, but he's just simply testifying as the president of the Monument Minerals.

HOLDER-DIRECT

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- A Could I just add to that?
- Q Yes, go ahead.

A I had a consulting geologist to testify, but he has a consulting job in Europe. He says they're paying him more than I do.

MR. HINKLE: He's not qualifying in that way. BY MR. HINKLE:

Q What is Silver Monument Minerals seeking to accomplish by this Application?

A We're seeking to accomplish an additional production of oil at the present time. Our thinking is that these surrounding wells, they are triple wells at the present time, that they haven't drained the entire area as well as they could have and we propose this unorthodox location for testing that purpose.

Now, in arriving at this conclusion, we have very excellent history of operations over across the State line over into Texas where the drilling is low 10-acre spacings in an old field and getting excellent results.

- Q Have you prepared or has there been prepared under your direction two Exhibits to introduce in this case?
 - A Yes.
 - Q Referring to Exhibit 1 and explain what this is and

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what it shows.

A This is the map? Exhibit 1 is a map of the area in 732 that Silver Monument Minerals operates. It is outlined by the red and black line.

- Q Silver Monument owns all the lease holdings interests within the red outline?
 - A That's correct.
- Q Does this show ownership of all the acreage in the area and surrounding acreage owned by Silver Monument?
 - A That's true.
- Q Does it also show the location of all producing wells?
 - A That's right, it does.
 - Q What proration are these wells producing?
 - A San Andres.
 - Q At approximately what depth?
 - A About 4350 to 4450.
- Q This also shows the location of the proposed infill or Five Spot Well in the southwest quarter, Section 25?
 - A Yes, sir.
- Q That would be located in the approximate center of the southwest quarter?
 - A Yes, sir.

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- Q Now, refer to Exhibit 2 and explain what that is?
- A Exhibit 2 is a tabulation of production of all the wells outlined in the Silver Monument area on the map and it shows that they are all stripper wells and the purpose of that was to show that there could be no damage to either existing wells or adjacent areas.
- Q Does Silver Monument own all of the offset acreage to this proposed location?
 - A Yes, sir.
- Q In the event this well does not turn out to be an economic producer, do you have any intention of using it in the future as a waterflood or injection well?
- A Yes, sir, I do. I intend to come back to the Commission and ask for it to be established as a water injection well. I can obtain some water about six miles south that would be compatible with the water in the San Andres for treatment and that would probably give us a real good study of the area.
- Q Then, in that event of waterflood project, you would also drill additional infill wells for injection wells?
 - A After considerable experimentation on it, yes.
 - Q Do you have anything further you would like to add?
 - A Not at all.

HOLDER-DIRECT CROSS

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- Q In your opinion, would the approval of this Application be in the interest of conservation and prevention of waste and protection of correlative rights?
 - A Yes, I think it very definitely would.
- Q You've had no objection from anyone to this location?
 - A None at all.

MR. HINKLE: That's all.

I would like to offer Exhibits 1 and 2.

MR. STAMETS: They will be admitted into evidence.

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Silver Monument Minerals, Inc., seeks approval for an unorthodox oil well location for the San Andres formation for a well to be drilled 1315 feet from the South line and 1315 feet from the West line of Section 25, Township 7 South, Range 32 East, NMPM, Chaveroo-San Andres Pool, Roosevelt County, New Mexico.
- (3) That the SW/4 SW/4 of Section 25 is to be dedicated to the well.
- (4) That said unorthodox location is proposed to determine whether infill drilling in the subject pool may recover oil which would otherwise not be recovered.
- (5) That no offset operator objected to the proposed unorthodox location.
- (6) That approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the oil in the Chaveroo-San Andres pool and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

- (2) That the SW/4 SW/4 of said Section 25 shall be dedicated to the well.
- (3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.


