MR. STAMETS: Case 5406

MR. DERRYBERRY: Case 5406. In the matter of the hearing called by the Oil Conservation Commission on its own motion to permit Oil Exploration, Inc., General Casualty Company of America and all other interested parties to appear and show cause why the Irwin Well No. 1 should not be plugged and abandoned in accordance with a Commission approved plugging program.

MR. CARR: Mr. Examiner, I am William Carr, appearing for the Commission. I have one witness to call, Mr. Carl Ulvog, who has previously been sworn.

MR. STAMETS: Let the record reflect that Mr. Ulvog was previously sworn and is still under oath.

CARL ULVOG

called as a witness, having been previously sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. CARR:

Q Mr. Ulvog, will you state your full name and your position and place of residence?

A Carl Ulvog, Senior Geologist for the Oil Conservation Commission here in Santa Fe.

Q Your duties with the Oil Conservation Commission

also include being District Supervisor for the Commission's District 4?

A That is correct.

Q Does District 4 include the part of Union County that is involved in this case?

A It does.

Q Do your duties as District Supervisor include making recommendations to the Commission as to when wells should be plugged and abandoned?

A That is correct.

Q Are you familiar with the subject matter in Case 5406?

A Yes, I am.

Q What is the purpose of this case?

A Our purpose here is to take whatever action may be necessary to bring compliance with the State Regulations with respect to abandoned wells. That is, which were drilled for oil and gas. This, of course, is to be assured that they are plugged in such a way that there will be no danger of pollution or no hazards to any animals or humans.

Q Are you familiar with the Irwin Well No. 1 which is the subject matter of this case?

A Yes, I am.

Q Have you reviewed all of the reports filed with the Commission concerning this well?

A Yes, I have.

Q Do you have these records with you?

A I do.

Q Would you please refer to them and give the Examiner a history, a brief history of the well as reflected in the official records?

A Yes, sir. We have two wells involved here, designated the No. 1 and the No. 1-A. I will run through the records for each and summarize them.

The Irwin Well No. 1 which is located 660 feet from the north line and 660 feet from the west line of Section 29, Township 21 North, Range 36 East. The application for the permit to drill this well was sent in September 26, 1955. There was no report of when the well started. The next report we have was on November 5th of 1955, at which time it was reported setting 437 feet of a 16-inch casing and 200 sacks of cement. The well record, the C-105 was received on June 22nd, 1956. It reported that the drilling was completed on January 3rd, 1956 at a total depth of 1010 feet and the well abandoned. There was no report of plugging filed. At that time it was also reported

that 744 feet of a 13 and 3/4-inch casing was set with 200 sacks of cement. There was a Notice of Intent to Plug received on April 2nd, 1956 at which time it was proposed that the 13 and 3/8 inch could be pulled and there would be plugs set at the top and the bottom of the 16-inch casing with a marker at the top. There were no subsequent reports received.

Requests for these reports were sent out October 31st, 1956, July 20th, 1960 and July 11th, 1974 with no response.

Now, if the cementing was done as reported, both of the casing strings were probably cemented to the surface, but this is an assumption. I don't know.

The Well No. 1-A which is located 750 feet from the north line and 660 feet from the west line of Section 29, Township 21 North, Range 36 East. The application for the permit to drill this well was filed January 25th, 1956. There was no report of when the operation began. There was a report filed on May 20th, 1956 to the effect that 7348 feet of 4 1/2-inch casing was set with 150 sacks of cement. There were no other reports of casing and cementing.

On June 5th, 1956, I have a report that the well was perforated from 7212 to 7220, acidized, swabbed water

and oil. At the same time, we received a report that there was a bridge plug set at 7050 and perforations were made at 6979 to 6987. The well again was acidized, swabbed water and oil. On June 13, 1956, we have a notice of an intent to plug at which time it was proposed that the 4½-inch casing would be pulled and a cement plug would be set at the top and bottom of the surface casing. We have had no report of any such casing, so I have no way of knowing where that would be.

A plugging report dated January 20th, 1957 and received here July 22nd, 1957 was submitted by the Dako Lease and Well Service Company of Borger, at which time they reported they pulled 1340 feet of a 4-inch casing and set a ten-sack plug at the bottom of the surface casing, but there was no depth given. Our request for additional information was sent out for this well on June 21st, 1957 and July 11th, 1974 and we never were successful in acquiring this.

Now, if the cementing was done as reported on this May 20th, 1956 report, there should have been about 750 feet of the 4½-inch casing cemented into the bore hole, presumably at the bottom. Dako's report of January 20th, 1957, shows 1340 feet of the 4½-inch casing was removed

from the well. From this, I can only conclude that there must have been something like 6000 feet of  $4\frac{1}{2}$ -inch casing left in the well and 750 feet at the bottom being cemented and the rest is not.

Now, the proposed casing program that was submitted with the permit application for this well indicated that the operator intended to set 10 and  $3/4$ -inch casing at 150 feet. Of course, we do not know if this was done, and if it was, this suggests there is an open hole from 150 feet below the surface to about 1340 feet depth and below that, about 5000 feet of uncemented  $4\frac{1}{2}$ -inch pipe. This is all that we know.

Q Mr. Ulvog, have you visited these wells?

A Yes, I have, on different occasions.

Q What did you find?

A I visited these locations on January 21st, 1975.

At that time, before going, I conferred with the present landowner, and I do not know what the connection between that landowner is and the former landowner, but nevertheless, this landowner did give me permission to inspect the well sites. I went there and found no evidence whatsoever of the wells, any disturbance of soils or anything else. The landowner advised me that he had cleaned it up, that he had

leveled it, that it is now all revegetated and there is no way that you can find -- I know that I probably walked directly over the wells, but you cannot see them. There is no evidence.

Q In your opinion, Mr. Ulvog, would leaving these wells in the present condition pose a potential threat to fresh water and --

A (Interrupting) I certainly do think so. If they are in the condition as we understand them to be.

Q What kind of a plugging program do you recommend for these wells?

A In view of the fact that the landowner reported that he would very much resist any efforts to re-enter these wells, and that he has knowledge that the wells were properly plugged and abandoned, I recommend that he be given 120 days to provide this information to the Oil Conservation Commission. If such information cannot be presented, I recommend that they be re-entered and plugged in accordance with our regulations.

Q So, in other words, your recommendation is that the landowner be given 120 days to satisfy the Commission that the wells were properly plugged and that the matter be taken care of further to require the wells to be plugged?

ULVOG-CROSS

A That is correct.

MR. CARR: I don't have anything further of this witness.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. STAMETS:

Q Mr. Ulvog, when you were there, did you observe any windmills or water wells in the vicinity of these two holes?

A It would be about a quarter of a mile away where there is a water well with a windmill on it, but there is irrigation in the area. There is irrigated farming. I can't say exactly how far it would be to the nearest irrigated field, probably a mile or so to the nearest irrigation project. I do not know the depth at which these irrigation wells are getting their water.

Q This situation has existed since 1957 or '58?

A That is correct, and on previous inspection trips that have been made to these wells, pictures were taken. They are a part of our files, and they show caving around the casings, they show casing standing open, they show boards and so on that partially cover the open places where the wells were drilled, together with the piles of waste that were left from digging the mud pits as well as

the mud pits themselves are shown in these pictures.

Q We have had the wells in this condition for something like 16 years with no apparent harmful effects?

A Yes.

Q To this point?

A That is correct.

Q With what little bit of knowledge that we have about the way the holes were left, if the wells had not been plugged and abandoned, do you think that a plugger could just go into these wells and plug them, or would he probably have to drill them out?

A I am quite sure he would have to drill them out for the simple reason that we -- let me back up -- we only have a report of one well being plugged. We aren't real sure which well it was. We are assuming that it is the No. 1-A because of the depths that were given, but in talking to the Dako Well Service people, they say they definitely plugged only one well. They had nothing to do with anything but one well. They have no records now as to which well. They are going strictly by memory, and they don't remember because the wells were, after all, only 100 feet apart. So, this is all we know.

MR. STAMETS: Are there any other questions of

a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the  
record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required  
by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the  
subject matter thereof.
- (2) That Oil Exploration, Inc., is the owner and operator  
of the Irwin Well No. 1 and Irwin "A" Well, both located in  
Unit D of Section 29, Township 21 North, Range 36 East, NMPM,  
Union County, New Mexico.
- (3) That both of said wells were drilled and abandoned  
prior to 1960.
- (4) That the Commission records of said wells do not  
demonstrate that they were plugged and abandoned in such a  
manner as to confine any oil, gas, or water in said wells  
in the strata in which they were originally found.

(5) That the owner of the lands upon which the subject wells were drilled contends that said wells were properly plugged and abandoned, and that no further plugging operations are necessary.

(6) That the surface around said wells has been restored and that there is now no surface indication of the location or condition of said wells.

(7) That in order to prevent waste and protect fresh waters said Irwin Well No. 1 and Irwin "A" Well should be plugged and abandoned in accordance with a program approved by the Santa Fe District Office of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on or before June 15, 1975, or any interested party should furnish proof that said wells have been properly plugged and abandoned.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That Oil Exploration, Inc. and General Casualty Company of America are hereby ordered to plug and abandon the Irwin Well No. 1 and Irwin "A" Well, both located in Unit D of Section 29, Township 21 North, Range 36 East, NMPM, Union County, New Mexico, on or before June 15, 1975, provided however, that the Secretary-Director of the Commission may rescind this order upon a satisfactory showing of proof that said wells have been adequately plugged.

(2) That Oil Exploration, Inc. and General Casualty Company of America, prior to plugging and abandoning the above-described wells, shall obtain from the Santa Fe Office of the Commission, a Commission-approved program for said plugging and abandoning, and shall notify said Santa Fe Office of the date and hour said work is to be commenced whereupon the Commission may, at its option, witness such work.

(3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.



Gentlemen:

The above-referenced wells were drilled by Oil Exploration, Inc., in 1955 and 1956, and were never properly plugged. Until they are, there is the possibility that fresh waters will be contaminated and that gas or fluids will migrate to other strata or to the surface. The Division has attempted to locate this company with no success.

I am therefore considering hiring a contractor at the State's expense to plug these wells. If this is acceptable to you, I would appreciate written permission to enter your property for this purpose. Or, if you have already performed the work yourself, I would appreciate having a detailed account of the plugging program you followed.

As you may be aware, in March of 1975 the Oil Conservation Commission issued its Order No. R-4986 requiring these wells to be plugged on or before June 15, 1975, unless satisfactory proof was submitted that the wells were adequately plugged. Such proof has not been offered by either the operator or yourselves. A considerable period of time has elapsed, and I'm sure you are as anxious as we are to have the matter resolved.

I hope to hear from you as soon as is convenient.

(7) That in order to prevent waste and protect fresh waters said Irwin Well No. 1 and Irwin "A" Well should be plugged and abandoned in accordance with a program approved by the Santa Fe District Office of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on or before June 15, 1975, or any interested party should furnish proof that said wells have been properly plugged and abandoned.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:


(1) That Oil Exploration, Inc. and General Casualty Company of America are hereby ordered to plug and abandon the Irwin Well No. 1 and Irwin "A" Well, both located in Unit D of Section 29, Township 21 North, Range 36 East, NMPM, Union County, New Mexico, on or before June 15, 1975, provided however, that the Secretary-Director of the Commission may rescind this order upon a satisfactory showing of proof that said wells have been adequately plugged.



Gentlemen:

Reference is made to our letter of October 10, 1956, wherein we inquired as to the present status of the above-captioned wells.

A recent visit to the location by a representative of this office reveals that, while you have apparently plugged the first well, neither well has been permanently abandoned as you have not completed the second, and the pits for both are still open.

Commission Rule 202 (c) states that "When drilling operations have been suspended for 60 days the well shall be plugged and abandoned unless a permit for temporary abandonment shall be obtained from the Commission."

Inasmuch as operations have been suspended for a period now of over 60 days we suggest that you either plug both wells or request a permit for temporary abandonment of the wells for whatever reasonable time that will be required.

If you desire to pursue the former course, please file C-102, Notice of Intention to Plug, outlining your proposed plugging program. If, on the other hand, you would

like to temporarily abandon the wells, please so request on Form C-102, stating the period of abandonment necessary.

We would also appreciate knowing when we may expect to receive Form C-105, Well Record, for the No. 1-A Well, as well as electric and radioactivity logs and cuttings samples.

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on February 5, 1975  
at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Richard L. Stamets.

NOW, on this March day of February, 1975, the Commission,  
a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record,  
and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised  
in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by  
law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject  
matter thereof.

(2) That Oil Exploration, Inc., is the owner and operator  
of the Irwin Well No. 1 and Irwin "A" Well, both located in  
Unit D of Section 29, Township 21 North, Range 36 East, NMPM,  
Union County, New Mexico.

(3) That both of said wells were drilled and abandoned prior to 1960.

(4) That the Commission records of ~~of~~ said wells do not demonstrate that they were plugged and abandoned in such a manner as to confine any oil, gas, or water in said wells in the strata in which they were originally found.

(5) (6) That the surface around said wells has been restored and that there is now no surface indication of the location or condition of said wells.

(5) (6) That the <sup>owner of the lands upon which</sup> ~~the subject~~ ~~wells were drilled~~ ~~contends that~~ ~~has indicated~~ ~~he does not wish~~ ~~the wells to be opened up for~~ ~~and that no further plugging operations are necessary.~~ ~~purposes of plugging and abandonment.~~

(7) That in order to prevent waste and protect <sup>fresh waters</sup> ~~correlative~~ ~~rights~~ said Irwin Well No. 1 and Irwin "A" Well should be plugged and abandoned in accordance with a program approved by the Santa Fe District Office of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on or before <sup>April</sup> May 15, 1975 )

or any interested party should ~~demonstrate~~ furnish proof that said wells have been properly plugged and abandoned.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That Oil Exploration, Inc. and General Casualty Company of America are hereby ordered to plug and abandon the Irwin Well No. 1 and Irwin "A" Well, both located in Unit D of Section 29, Township 21 North, Range 36 East, NMPM, Union County, New Mexico, on or before ~~May~~<sup>June</sup> 15, 1975,

*or furnish proof that said wells have been properly plugged and abandoned.*

(2) That Oil Exploration, Inc. and General Casualty Company of America, prior to plugging and abandoning the above-described well, shall obtain from the Santa Fe Office of the Commission, a Commission-approved program for said plugging and abandoning, and shall notify said Santa Fe Office of the date and hour said work is to be commenced whereupon the Commission may, at its option, witness such work.

(3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
