NOW, on this 24th day of November, 1953, the Commission, a quorum being present,


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
That the treating project as contemplated by the applicant does not require an order of the Commission.

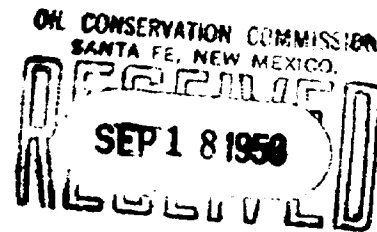


