TRANSCRIPT OF PROCEEDINGS

MR. WHITE: If the Commission please, there were a good many of the operators under a misunderstanding as to what kind of testimony should be introduced on the unorthodox units. In this case, as to the unorthodox units, we have no contest or protest to it, and for that reason, I have no witnesses available.

In regard to the two applications, the applicant is the owner and operator of the lease in the west half of the west half of Section 7, Township 20 South, Range 37 East, and the east half of the east half of Section 12 in Range 36 East. We would like to have the plats attached to our respective applications, marked Exhibits 1 and 2 respectively; and in regard to the wells, there are two producing, one in each unit, and they have been producing since 1936 from the Yates Sands, from our exhibit; we would like to have them marked and introduced as Exhibit No. 3, wells producing in the

belief that the Yates Sands is productive throughout both of the unorthodox units applied for. We have here the consent from Amerida and Sinclair, and from the Anderson-Pritchard, who are the adjoining operators. We would like to have them marked Exhibit 5, 6 and 7, accordingly. We have had the verbal consent of Skelly, and Mr. Selinger was going to consent before the Commission had he been here. It is my understanding that the Continental, who off-sets us to the north in another section, will not consent to it, but they will not protest either, is that correct, Mr. Kellahin?

MR. KELLAHIN: That is correct. We won't grant a waiver.

MR. WHITE: We do believe it is based on sound engineering principles, and if granted, will not create a chain effect and bring about the need for other unorthodox units. It will prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

MR. SPURRIER: Is there objection to counsel's proposed cases? If not, we will take them under advisement. Are there any other cases now before the meeting is adjourned?

APPLICATION

Comes now Sunray Oil Corporation, applicant herein, and respectfully shows to the Honorable Oil Conservation Commission of the State of New Mexico as follows:

- 1. That applicant is the owner and operator of an oil and gas lease known as its A. Cooper lease, covering the W/2 of the W/2 of Section 7 Twp. 20S Rge. 37E, and the E/2 of the E/2 of Section 12 Twp. 20S Rge. 36E, Lea County, New Mexico. Order R-370-A requires standard proration units to be in the form of a square, which is a governmental quarter section. It is desired to form an unorthodox gas proration unit consisting of the W/2 of the W/2 of Section 7 Twp. 20S Rge. 37E. for the A. Cooper Well No. 3.
- 2. Applicant's A. Cooper Well No. 3 was completed on February 6, 1936 to a total depth of 3895'. This well is presently producing gas from the Yates formation, encountered at 2890'.
- 3. Unitization of portions of this tract with other tracts within Section 12 so as to form a standard 160-acre gas proration unit is impractical.
- 4. Attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference is a plat showing the location of the unit well and the outline of the proposed 160-acre gas proration unit.

WHEREFORE applicant prays that this matter be set for hearing, that notice be given thereof as required by law, and that upon final hearing the Oil Conservation Commission of the State of New Mexico enter its order authorizing applicant to assign an unorthodox gas proration unit to this well in accordance with this application and the rules and regulations of the Oil Conservation Commission.

R-370-A IN ESTABLISHMENT OF AN UNORTHODOX GAS PRORATION UNIT OF 160 CONTIGUOUS ACRES CONSISTING OF WEST HALF OF THE WEST HALF OF SECTION 7, TOWNSHIP 20 SOUTH, RANGE 37 EAST, NMPM., LEA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, IN THE EUMONT GAS POOL.

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock a. m., on March 17, 1954, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before the Oil Conservation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission".

NOW, on this day of April, 1954, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the records and testimony adduced, and being fully advised in the premises;

FINDS:

- (1) That due notice of the time and place of hearing and the purpose thereof having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this case and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That pursuant to provisions of Rule 7 (a) of Order No. R-370-A, the Commission has power and authority to permit the formation of a gas provation unit consisting of other than a legal quarter section after notice and hearing by the Commission.
- (3) That applicant, Sunray Oil Corporation, is the owner of an oil and gas lease in Lea County, New Mexico the land consisting of other than a legal quarter section, and described as follows, to-wit:

TOWNSHIP 20 South, RANGE 37 East, NMPM.

West half of the West Half of Section 7

containing 160 acres, more or less.

- (4) That applicant, Sunray Oil Corporation, has a producing well on the aforesaid lease known as Alaska Cooper, No. 3, located 660' from the North line and 660' from the West line of Section 7, Township 20 South, Range 37 East.
- (5) That the aforesaid well was completed and in production prior to January 1, 1954, the effective date of Order No. R-370-A, and is located

within the limits of the pool heretofore delineated and designated as the Eumont Gas Pool.

- (6) That it is impractical to pool applicant's said lease with adjoining acreage in the West Half of Section 7, Township 20 South, Range 37 East and that the owners of adjoining acreage in said quarter sections have not objected to the formation of the proposed proration unit of 160 acres.
- (7) That unless a proration unit consisting of applicant's aforesaid acreage is permitted, applicant will be deprived of the opportunity to recover its just and equitable share of the natural gas in the Eumont Gas Pool.
- (8) That creation of a proration unit consisting of the aforesaid acreage will not cause but will prevent waste, will protect correlative rights and is necessary to prevent confiscation of applicant's property.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That the application of Sunray Oil Corporation for approval of an unorthodox proration unit consisting of the following described acreage:

TOWNSHIP 20 South, RANGE 37 East, NMPM.

West half of the West half of Section 7

be and the same is hereby approved, and a proration unit consisting of aforesaid acreage is hereby created.

(2) That applicant's well, Alaska Cooper, No. 3, located in the NW/4 NW/4 of Section 7, Township 20 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, shall be granted an allowable from January 1, 1954 in the proportion that the above described 160 acre unit bears to the standard or orthodox proration unit for said pool, all until further order of the Commission.
