No. 1, locatei is the center of the southeast quarter of the northwest quarter of Section 21.

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Q Does it outline the acreage that Hunt seeks for approval?

A Yes, it outlines the acreage of the Weathorly Lease which consists of the northwest quarter of the section and the west half of the northeast, 240 acres.

Q Who are the working interest owners and the lessors under this proposed lease?

A The working interest corres are N. B. Hunt, W. H. Hunt and Lamar Hunt, and the least correct are W. W. Weatherly and wife, Mittie N. Weatherly.

Q What is the location of the Mittie N. Meatherly No. 1?

A The Weatherly No. 1 is 1980 feet from the north line and 650 feet from the west line of Section 21.

Q Do you know when that well was completed?

A This well was completed in January of 1939.

Q In what formation was it completed?

A The Weatherly No. 1 was completed in the Queens Formation.

Q Was it productive of oil at that time?

A Yes, sir, it was an oil producer.

Q In other words, Mr. Rohe, this well was not completed to any production early?

A That is correct.

Q How has the well been classified from the time of its completion up to the present time, do you know?

A This well has been carried on the pronation schedule of the Penrose-Skelly Pool, producing from the Queen formation.

The District Engineer points out that the ratio of this well is in excess of 100,000 to 1, indicates this well should be reclassified as a gas well in the Sumont Pool, and requests; further, that N. 4 At the time that the Mittle Weatherly Well was irilled, did it conform to the requirements of the Commission as to spacing and well location?

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A Yes, śir, it did.

Q In the Queens Formation?

A Yes, sir.

Q I hand you what has been marked as N. B. Hunt's Exhibit 3 and ask you to state what that shows.

A This is a plat showing Section 21 and the Mittie N. Weatherly Lease, consisting of 240 acres for which the non-standard proration unit is requested. This plat shows the location of the Weatherly No. 1 Well from the boundary lines and for the convenience of the Commission, we have plotted on here to scale, a radius of influence equivalent to 3,735 feet. From a study of this plat can be seen that all of the acres in the Mittie N. Weatherly Lease are included within the radius of influence.

Q That would include all but a very small fraction in the corner?

A That is correct. There is a fraction of an acre in the northeast corner of the lease that would not be covered within the radius of influence.

THE APPLICATION OF N. B. HUNT FOR AN ORDER GRANTING APPROVAL OF AN EXCEPTION PURSUANT TO RULE 5 (a) OF THE SPECIAL RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE EUMONT GAE POOL AS SET FORTH IN ORDER R-520 IN ESTABLISHMENT OF A NON-STANDARD GAS PRORATION UNIT OF 240 CONTIGUOUS ACRES CONSISTING OF THE NW/4 AND THE W/2 NE/4 OF SECTION 21, TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 37 EAST, NMPM, LEA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO.

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock a.m. on April 20, 1955, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before the Oil Conservation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission."

NOW, on this 11th day of March 1956, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the records and testimony adduced, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due notice of the time and place of hearing and the purpose thereof having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this case and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That pursuant to the provisions of Rule 5 (a) of the Special Rules and Regulations of the Eumont Gas Pool, as contained in Order R-520, the Commission has power and authority to permit the formation of a gas provation unit consisting of other than a legal section after notice and hearing by the Commission.

(3) That applicant, N. B. Hunt, is the owner of an oil and gas lease in Lea County, New Mexico, the land consisting of other than a legal section, and described as follows, to-wit:

> TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 37 EAST, NMPH RW/4 & W/2 RE/4 of Section 21

containing 240 acres, more or less.

(4) That applicant, N. B. Hunt, has a producing well on the aforesaid lease known as N. B. Hunt's Mittie Weatherly Well No. 1, located 1980 feet FNL and 660 feet KWL of said Section 21, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico.

(5) That the aforesaid well was in production prior to the effective date of Order R-520 and is located within the horizontal limits of the pool heretofore delineated and designated as the Eumont Gas Pool.

(6) That it is impractical to pool applicant's aforesaid lease with adjoining acreage in the Eumont Gas Pool, and that owners of adjoining acreage in said area have not objected to the formation of the proposed provation unit of 240 acres.

(7) That unless a proration unit consisting of applicant's aforesaid acreage is permitted, applicant will be deprived of the opportunity to recover its just and equitable share of the natural gas in the Eugent Gas Pool.

(8) That the creation of a proration unit consisting of the aforesaid acreage will not cause, but will prevent waste and will protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That the application of N. B. Hunt for approval of a non-standard gas proration unit in the Eumont Gas Pool consisting of the following described acreage:

TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 37 EAST, NMPH NW/4 & W/2 NE/4 of Section 21

be and the same is hereby approved and a proration unit consisting of 240 acres be and the same is hereby created effective April 1, 1986.

(2) That applicant's well, Mittie N. Weatherly Well No. 1, located in the SW/4 of the NW/4 of Section 21, Township 21 South, Range 37 Kast, NMPM, in the Eumont Gas Pool, be and the same is hereby granted an allowable effective April 1, 1956, in the proportion that the above described 240 acre unit bears to the standard unit for said pool, all until further order of the Commission.

Dear Mr. Macey:

In connection with the hearing which has been called for February 15, 1956, Case No. 1019 proposes to extend the limits of the Eumont Gas Pool, re-define the limits of the Penrose-Skelly Oil Pool, and abolish the Arrow Gas Pool. I would like to call to your attention the application of N. B. Hunt in Case No. 873, hearing on which application was held April 20, 1955. No order has yet been entered in Case No. 873, which was an application for a non-standard gas proration unit for N. B. Hunt's Weatherly No. 1 Well, consisting of the NW/4 and the W/2 of the NE/4, Section 21, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, containing 240 acres, more or less.

Action on Case No. 873 was withheld pending entry of orders by the Commission in Cases No. 881 and No. 884, and it is my understanding that no orders have been entered in either of these two cases.

Upon extension of the horizontal limits of the Eumont Gas Pool to include the Weatherly No.1Well, I believe it would be proper to enter an order in Case No. 873, as the Commission may determine upon the basis of the testimony and evidence offered at the April, 1955, hearing. As you will recall, the Weatherly No. 1 Well and N. B. Hunt's Wantz Nos. 1 and 2 Weils have been produced under a special gas allowable assigned each month by the Commission since their deletion from the Penrose-Skelly Oil Pool and re-classification as gas wolls.

If anything further is needed from us in connection with Case No. 873, I would appreciate it if you would advise me of that fact.

APPLICATION

Applicant, N. B. Hunt, for himself and on behalf of Lamar Hunt and W. H. Hunt, hereby applies to the Commission pursuant to Rule 5, of the Commission's Order No. R-520 issued on August 12, 1954, in Case No. 673, for an order approving a non-standard gas provation unit in the Eumont Gas Pool comprising the $NW_{\frac{1}{4}}^{\frac{1}{2}}$ and the $W_{\frac{1}{2}}^{\frac{1}{2}}$ of the $NE_{\frac{1}{4}}^{\frac{1}{4}}$ of Section 21, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico, as reflected on the plat attached hereto and marked Exhibit A, containing 240 acres, more or less.

In support of this application, Applicant states:

1. That Applicant, N. B. Hunt, Lamar Hunt and W. H. Hunt are the present owners of all operating rights in the proposed non-standard gas proration unit.

2. That J. M. Rush, a predecessor in interest of Applicant, has heretofore drilled the Mittie N. Weatherly No. 1 Well in accordance

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with the rules and regulations then in effect, at a location in the center of the SW_{4}^{1} of the NW_{4}^{1} of Section 21, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico, and completed the same on January 4, 1939, as a commercial well productive of oil from the Penrose Skelly pool.

3. That the Cil Conservation Commission of the State of New Mexico notified Applicant by letter dated March 7, 1955, that this well should be re-classified as a gas well in the Eumont Pool.

4. That the proposed non-standard gas proration unit consists of contiguous quarter-quarter sections.

5. That the proposed non-standard gas proration unit lies wholly within Section 21, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico.

6. That in the opinion of Applicant the entire proposed nonstandard gas proration unit may reasonably be presumed to be productive of gas.

7. That the length or width of the proposed non-standard gas proration unit does not exceed 5,280 feet.

8. That Applicant has on March <u>A</u>, 1955, notified (a) operators owning interests in Sec. 21, T.21 S., R. 37 E., N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico, and (b) operators owning interest within 1,500 feet of the Mittie N. Weatherly Well No. 1 of Applicant's intent to form such
