- Q As to the east half of the west half, who is the owner of all rights in there?
 - A El Paso Natural Gas Company.
 - Q Both oil and gas?
 - A Yes.
- Q So that, as to the entire west half of Section 29, El Paso Natural Gas Company owns all gas rights to a depth of 4,000 feet?
 - A That is right.

- Q Will you state to the Commission your training, professional training?
- A I am a graduate engineer of Texas College of Mines and Metallurgy, with a degree in Master of Science and Mining Engineer, and Geology optional.
 - Q What experience have you had?
- A I have had six years as Division Geologist for El Paso Natural Gas.
 - Q Are you registered as an engineer in the State?
 - A Yes, sir.
- Q Have you supervised drilling operations for El Paso Natural Gas Company in the Lea County area?
 - A Yes, sir.
- Q Have you prepared, or had prepared under your supervision, a plat showing the west half of Section 29, Township 26 South, Range 37 East in Lea County?
 - A Yes, sir.
 - Q Do you have copies?
 - A Yes, sir.

MR. HOWELL: Will you please mark this as Exhibit 1?

(Marked El Paso Natural Gas Company's Exhibit No. 1, for identification.)

- Q Referring to Exhibit 1, will you state to the Commission what is reflected on that plat?
- A It shows the location of the El Paso Natural Gas Parker No.

 1, including the offset wells to the west and also to the north, and with no wells being offset to the south.
 - Q Are there any other wells at all located on the Section 29?

- A No, sir.
- Q You have shown on this plat the location of wells in offset sections?
 - A Yes, sir.
- Q What was the date of completion of the El Paso Natural Gas Company's Parker No. 1?
 - A This well was completed April 14, 1935.
 - Q Has it been producing some 20 years?
 - A Yes, sir.
- Q Have you made, or had made under your supervision, a study as to the number of acres which could reasonably be drained by this well?
 - A Yes, sir, we have.
- Q State to the Commission the basis of the study, the known figures that you used and the assumptions that you made.
- A Based upon the production history on this well, the amount of gas that it has produced with the pressure, and making a volumetric study through January, 1954, this well had produced 8,580,463,000 cubic feet. Based on the volume study and the pressure decline, we have estimated the amount of gas that was originally in place, assuming a pay thickness of 50 feet, based upon --
- Q (Interrupting) Let me interrupt just a minute. Why did you assume a pay thickness of 50 feet?
- A That was based on the study of surrounding wells and the producing section that was indicated in the logs and the study of the surrounding wells.
 - Q You have a log of the Parker No. 1?
 - A No. sir. we do not.

- Q There was no log made at the time it was drilled and completed in 1935?
- A No, sir, nothing other than a sample log. Based upon that figure, on our estimates, the Parker would drain in excess of 587 acres.
- Q State whether or not in your opinion, the entire 320 acres in the west half of Section 29 may reasonably be presumed to be productive of gas?
- A I think, based upon the production history and our studies, plus the geological studies, that this well would drain the 320 acres.

MR. HOWELL: I think that is all.

MR. MACEY: Any questions of the witness? Mr. Nutter?

CROSS EXAMINATION

By MR. NUTTER:

- Q Perhaps I should have asked Mr. Howell's first witness this question, but, as I understand it, this well is plugged back to 3,043 feet.
 - A That is correct.
- Q El Paso owns the gas rights in the west half of the west half of Section 29, down to a depth of 4,000 feet?
 - A That is right.
- Q They own all the gas and oil rights, regardless of depth, in the east half of the west half?
 - A That is right.
- Q Therefore, no communitization of the property is necessary to give this well the 320-acre allowable?
 - A That is correct.

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMBSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock a.m. on July 14, 1955, and on August 17, 1955, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before the Oil Conservation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission".

NOW, on this day of September, 1955, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the records and testimony adduced, and being fully advised in the premises.

FINDS:

- (1) That due notice of the time and place of hearing and the purpose thereof having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this case and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That pursuant to provisions of Rule 5 (a) of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Jalmat Gas Pool of Order No. R-520, the Commission has power and authority to permit the formation of a gas proration unit consisting of other than a legal section after notice and hearing by the Commission.
- (3) That applicant, El Pase Naturel Gas Company, is the owner of gas rights down to a depth of 4000 feet in W/2 of W/2 of Section 29, Township 26 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, in Lea County, New Mexico, and oil and gas rights under the E/2 W/2 of Section 29, Township 26 South, Range 37 East, containing 320 acres more or less.
- (4) That applicant, El Paso Natural Gas Company, has a producing well on the aforesaid lease known as M. L. Parker Well No. 1, and situated 660' from the North line and 660' from the West line of Section 29, Township 26 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.

- (5) That the aforesaid well was completed and in production on April 14, 1935, prior to August 12, 1954, the effective date of Order No. R-520, and is located within the horizontal and vertical limits of the pool heretofore delineated and designated as the Jalmat Gas Pool.
- (6) That it is impractical to pool applicant's said lease with adjoining acreage in the Jalmat Gas Pool and that the owners of adjoining acreage in said area have not objected to the formation of the proposed proration unit of 320 acres.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That the application of El Paso Natural Gas Company, for approval of a non-standard proration unit consisting of the following described acreage:

TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 37 EAST, NMPM W/Z of Section 29

be and the same is hereby approved.

(2) That applicant's well, M. L. Parker Well No. 1, located in the Jalmat Gas Pool, shall be granted an allowable in the proportion that the above described 320 acre unit bears to the standard or orthodox proration unit for said pool, all until further order of the Commission.


