ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock a.m. on September 13, 1956, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before the Oil Conservation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission."

NOW, on this 27th day of September, 1956, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the record herein and the evidence and testimony adduced and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due notice of the time and place of hearing and the purpose thereof having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this case and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That the working interest owners of acreage in the proposed unit have entered into a communitization agreement.

(3) That certain royalty interests in the unit have not been communitized by agreement.

(4) That all interests should be communitized in said unit in order to serve the interests of conservation and protect correlative rights therein.

(5) That applicant is the owner of the Sarah Phillips No. 2 Well located in the NE/4 SW/4 of said Section 33, Township 19 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico, to which this unit should be dedicated.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That the application of Amerada Petroleum Corporation for an order granting an exception to Rule 5 (a) of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Eumont Gas Pool as set forth in Order R-520 for the establishment of a 240-acre non-standard gas proration unit consisting of the SW/4, the SW/4 of the NW/4 and the SW/4 of the SE/4 of Section 33, Township 19 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico, be and the same is hereby granted.

(2) That applicant's well, the Sarah Phillips No. 2 Well, located in the NE/4 SW/4 of Section 33, Township 19 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, Eumont Gas Pool, Lea County, New Mexico, shall be granted an allowable in the proportion that the above-described 240-acre unit bears to the standard proration unit for said pool, according to Rule 12 of the Pool Rules, all until further order of the Commission.

(3) That all interests within the vertical limits of the Eumont Gas Pool under the 240-acres herein described be and the same are hereby pooled.



CASE NO. 1104APPLICATION

Comes now Amerada Petroleum Corporation and alleges and states the following in this Application:

1. That Applicant, Amerada Petroleum Corporation, is owner of the operating rights in and under the SW/4 of SW/4 and the E/2 of SW/4 of Section 33, Township 19 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico.

2. That Applicant is owner of the Sarah Phillips No. 2 Well, located in the NE/4 of SW/4 of said Section 33, as shown on the attached Exhibit "A" heretofore completed in the Monument Oil Pool on March 10, 1937, and recompleted in the Queens Formation of the Eumont Gas Pool on December 14, 1955, as a dual completion by authority of D.C. Order No. 263, dated December 29, 1955. This well is now currently assigned an 80-acre allowable in the Eumont Gas Pool in accordance with the Commission's non-standard gas proration unit order No. 228, dated February 8, 1956, and Applicant hereby seeks approval to dedicate to said well the 240 acres herein described.

3. That all owners of the oil and gas leases covering the lands described in caption, including Gulf Oil Corporation, owner of the operating rights in the SW/4 of NW/4 and NW/4 of SW/4 of said Section 33, and Sinclair Oil and Gas Company, owner of the operating rights in the SW/4 of SE/4 of said Section 33, have entered into an agreement to pool their operating interests in the 240-acre Non-Standard Gas Proration Unit herein proposed.

4. That all owners of the operating rights have notified all royalty owners under their respective leases of this proposed plan and are making diligent efforts to secure voluntary pooling of all their interests in the herein proposed proration unit.

5. That the establishment of the 240-acre Non-Standard Gas Proration Unit comprising the lands herein described as an exception to Rule 5(a) of Order R-520, Special Rules and Regulations for the Eumont Gas Pool, is necessary to prevent waste; and the pooling of all interests therein will afford the owner of each tract in the unit the opportunity to recover and receive his just and equitable share of the gas in the Eumont Gas Pool.

WHEREFORE, Applicant respectfully requests that this application be set for hearing, that notice of such hearing be given as required by law, and, upon the conclusion of said hearing, that this Commission enter its order approving the formation of a non-standard gas proration unit in exception to Rule 5(a) of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Eumont Gas Pool as

set forth in Order R-520, consisting of the SW/4, SW/4 of NW/4 and SW/4 of SE/4, Section 33, Township 19 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico; granting to the Sarah Phillips #2 well an allowable in the proportion that the above described 240-acre unit bears to the standard 640-acre proration unit for the Eumont Gas Pool; and pooling all interests in the gas rights within the vertical limits of the Eumont Gas Pool under the 240 acres herein described, in the manner as herein provided.




