Pan American Petroleum Corporation hereby requests that a case be set for hearing to consider its application for an order permitting the transfer of the allowable of its State "A" Tract 9 No. 13 to wells on the State "A" Tract 5 Lease, Hobbs Pool, Lea County, New Mexico. It is proposed to convert State "A" Tract 9 No. 13 to a salt water disposal well and to transfer its remaining allowable to other wells on the same basic lease. The State "A" Tract 9 and the State "A" Tract 5 Leases are portions of the same basic State of New Mexico Lease and the institutional recipients of revenue from this lease is the School of the Deaf, Dumb and Blind.

The total remaining reserves of the State "A" Tract 9 No. 13 are estimated to be 11,900 barrels based on the production decline trend for this well. It is proposed that this 11,900 barrels of remaining allowable be transferred and produced at a rate of 5 barrels per day, which is the current allowable for the well.

Pan American Petroleum Corporation further requests that this case be heard at the March 14 regular hearing of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission. For simplification of presentation it is requested that this case be heard in conjunction with the companion case regarding conversion of State "A" Tr. 9 No. 13 to a salt water disposal well.
