SUPPLEMENT NO. 6 (effective as of April 1, 1947) to Order No. 633

Recommendations of New Mexico Nomenclature Committee
dated February 27, 1947

1. Define a new pool called Bitter Lake Pool to include all of Sec. 13, E/2 of Sec. 14, NE/4 of Sec. 23, and N/2 of Sec. 24, T-10-S, R-25-E.
2. Extend the West Roberts Pool to include the S/2 of Sec. 11, and SW/4 of Sec. 12, T-17-S, R-32-E.
3. Extend the West Eunice Pool to include the NW/4 and the S/2 of Sec. 23, and the SW/4 of Sec. 24, T-21-S, R-34-E.
4. Extend the Grayburg Jackson Pool to include the N/2 of the S/2 of Sec. 32, the N/2 of the SW/4 and the SE/4 of Sec. 33, the S/2 of Sec. 34, the N/2 of the S/2 of Sec. 35, and the N/2 of Sec. 36, T-17-S, R-29-E. The area now to be included in the Loco Hills Pool in T-17-S, R-29-E, would include the S/2 of Sec. 31, S/2 of the S/2 of Sec. 32, the S/2 of the SW/4 of Sec. 33, S/2 of the S/2 of Sec. 35, and the S/2 of Sec. 36.
5. Define a new pool to include Sec. 13 and 24, T-9-S, R-37-E, and Sec. 18 and 19, T-9-S, R-38-E, to be known as the Sawyer Pool.
6. Extend the Langlie Mattix Pool to include the S/2 of Sec. 24, T-23-S, R-36-E. This extension was made necessary by the drilling of T & P State A #17, located 660' from South and East lines of Sec. 24-23-36.

All in Township 17 South, Range 29 East, T.17.S.17. in Eddy County, New Mexico,
is hereby deleted from the loco hills pool, and the description set out for
said loco hills pool in Commission's order No. 633 is hereby amended, in this
particular only, to exclude the said described land from said pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the boundaries of the Grayburg-Jackson Pool be and the same hereby are extended so as to include therein the following described lands:



Dear Sir:

In your letter of April 21, 1947, you transmitted a copy of Supplement No. 6 (effective as of April 1, 1947) to Order No. 633 which was made in response to recommendations of the New Mexico Nomenclature Committee, dated February 27, 1947. I am glad that you called our attention to the fact that the Commission can not delete any part of any pool without formal notice and an open hearing. In the future, our recommendations will be made to conform with this regulation. In checking Supplement No. 6, it is noticed that under Item 4, the Grayburg Jackson Pool is extended, and in doing so, the wording also deletes part of what is now Loco Hills Pool in order to extend the Grayburg Jackson. It is thought that this was an oversight, since it was pointed out that in order to delete this, a hearing would be necessary.

This is being called to your attention so that the matter can be posted for hearing if it is so desired. I would suggest that you discuss this with Mr. Staley and it is possible that he could file petition for the Nomenclature Committee.

We would still be glad to have you come down for some of our future meetings of the Lea County Petroleum Society, and in the event that you can foresee a convenient date in the future, I would appreciate your advising me so that a program could be planned.
