ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock a.m. on September 21, 1960, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Daniel S. Hutter, Examiner duly appointed by the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission," in accordance with Rule 1214 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.

NOW, on this 3rd day of October, 1960, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the application, the evidence adduced, and the recommendations of the Examiner, Daniel S. Hutter, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That the applicant proposes to store Empire-Abo Pool oil production from its Malco "N" Lease, comprising the NE/4 and the E/2 SW/4 of Section 15, Township 18 South, Range 27 East, NEPM, Eddy County, New Mexico, in a separate tank battery to be located on its State "BR" Lease, comprising the NE/4 SE/4 of Section 16, Township 18 South, Range 27 East, NEPM, Eddy County, New Mexico.

(3) That the said Empire-Abo Pool oil production from the above-described Malco "N" Lease will not be commingled with the production from any other lease, including the production from the said State "BR" Lease.

(4) That approval of the subject application will neither cause waste nor impair correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Pan American Petroleum Corporation, be and the same is hereby authorized to store Empire-Alco Pool oil production from its State "W" lease, comprising the NW/4 and the E/2 SW/4 of Section 15, Township 18 South, Range 27 East, NEPM, Sddy County, New Mexico, in a separate tank battery to be located on its State "NR" lease, comprising the NE/4 NW/4 of Section 16, Township 18 South, Range 27 East, NEPM, Sddy County, New Mexico.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That the said Empire-Alco Pool oil production from the said State "W" lease shall not be commingled with the production from any other lease, including the production from the said State "NR" lease.

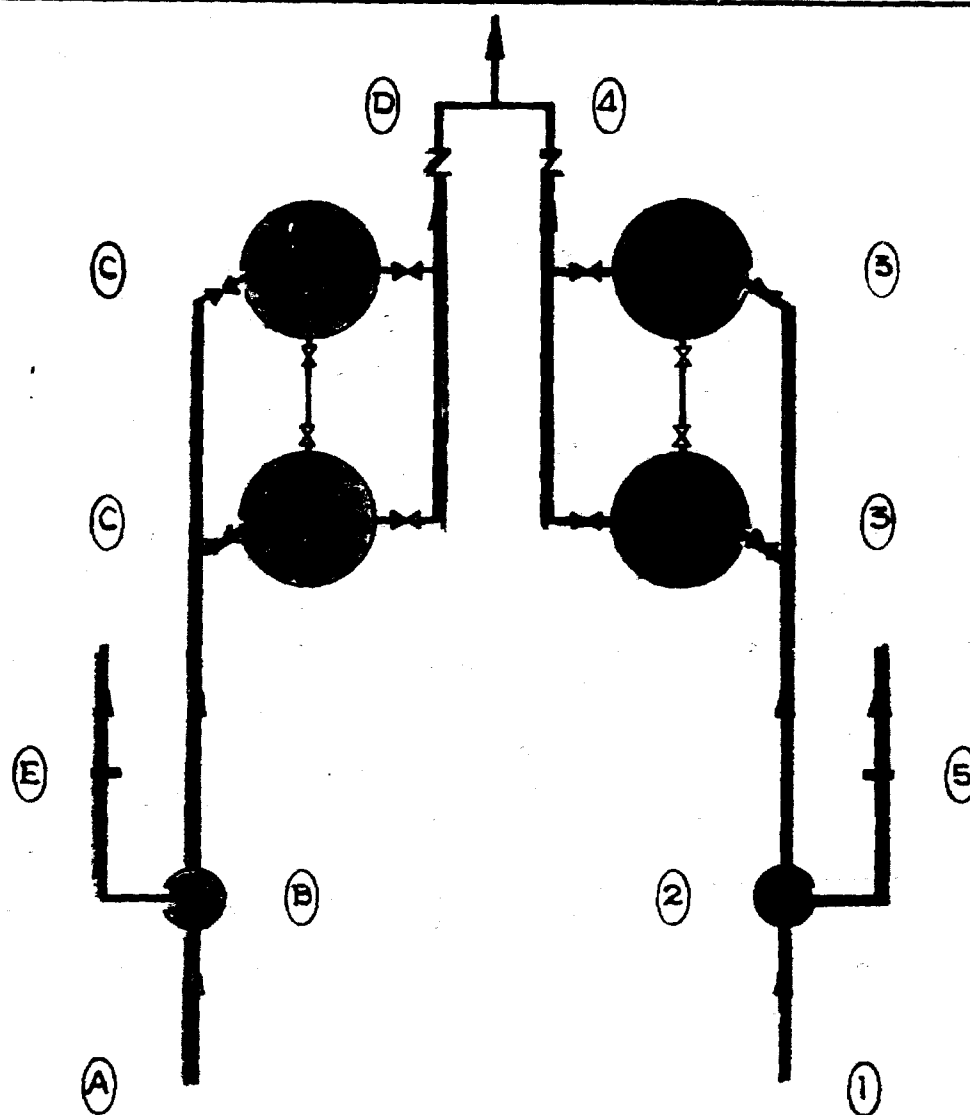

Your telegram of July 25 requests approval to store Empire Abo production from that portion of lease New Mexico 025602 described as the NW $\frac{1}{4}$, N $\frac{1}{2}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 15, T. 18 S., R. 27 E., N.M.P.M., Eddy County, New Mexico in separate tankage at the site of your State "BR" lease tank battery, in lieu of commingling said production with that being produced into the central storage installation in sec. 3, T. 18 S., R. 27 E., as was approved by our letter of July 14. You have stated that the quantity of water being produced by your Malco "N" well No. 1 is such that you do not wish to commingle its production in the central storage area in sec. 3. You have expressed doubt, however, that a pipeline connection could be secured if storage were made on the lease and propose to produce the Malco "N" No. 1 through a separate heater into separate tankage at the site of your State "BR" lease tank battery where a pipeline connection is already available.

MR. PAYNE: Application of Pan American Petroleum Corporation for off-lease storage of oil.

MR. NEWMANN: Kirk Newmann, Atwood and Malone, Roswell, representing the Applicant. We have one witness.

Q Will you state your name and employment, please, sir?

A Albert H. Green, Petroleum Engineer, Pan American Petroleum, Lubbock, Texas.

Q Have you previously testified before the Commission?

A Yes, sir.

Q Are the witness' qualifications accepted?

MR. NUTTER: Yes, sir. Please proceed.

Q (By Mr. Newman) Would you state the purpose and the reasons for the application in this case?

A Pan American wishes to store production from their Malco "N" Lease which is shown outlined in red on the first attachment of the exhibit, move production from that lease to the adjoining State "BR" Lease which is outlined in green, for purposes of saving investment and gas flow lines and to reduce the operating cost by what would be considered a consolidation and centralization of tank batteries without actually commingling production.

Q What would be the length of the flow line to the offset battery?

A The flow line from the Malco Number 1 Well to the proposed battery as situated will be 1100 feet.

Q Will there be any commingling of production from this Malco 1 "N" Well with other production from other leases or wells?

A No, sir, none whatsoever.

Q Will you refer to the second attachment of the proposed Exhibit and state what it shows, sir?

A Attachment 2 of the exhibit is a schematic drawing showing the flow routing of production from the two leases involved. The color scheme is presented to coincide with the first attachment. The drawing shows that production from each well enters its respective treater where gas is separated from the oil production, the oil production passes onto the individual storage tank where it is run to the pipe line transporter. The gas production from each lease is shown leaving the treaters, passing through individual gas production meters and onto the gas purchaser.

Q Will you state briefly what your third attachment of the exhibit is?

A The third attachment is consent from the USGS of this off-lease storage proposal.

Q What is your 4th attachment?

A Attachment 4 is approval of the Commissioner of Public Lands for our proposed off-lease storage.

Q Is there any possible way that correlative rights could be effected by this granting of this application?

A In my opinion none whatsoever.

Q Is there any way that waste could be caused by granting of the application?

A No, sir.

Q Would the granting of the application serve to prevent waste?

A Yes, sir, economic waste.



Q Would it also permit the extended production of the well on the Malco "N" Lease by reducing the cost of operating that well?

A Yes, sir.

Q Was this exhibit and attachment prepared by you or under your direction?

A Yes, sir.

Q We offer the exhibit.

MR. NUTTER: Pan American Exhibit Number 1 will be admitted, a bundle of four sheets. Any questions of Mr. Green? Mr. Payne.

BY MR. PAYNE:

Q Mr. Green, there will be no commingling of the production from the two leases, is that right?

A That is correct, no commingling of all your gas production prior to sale.
