

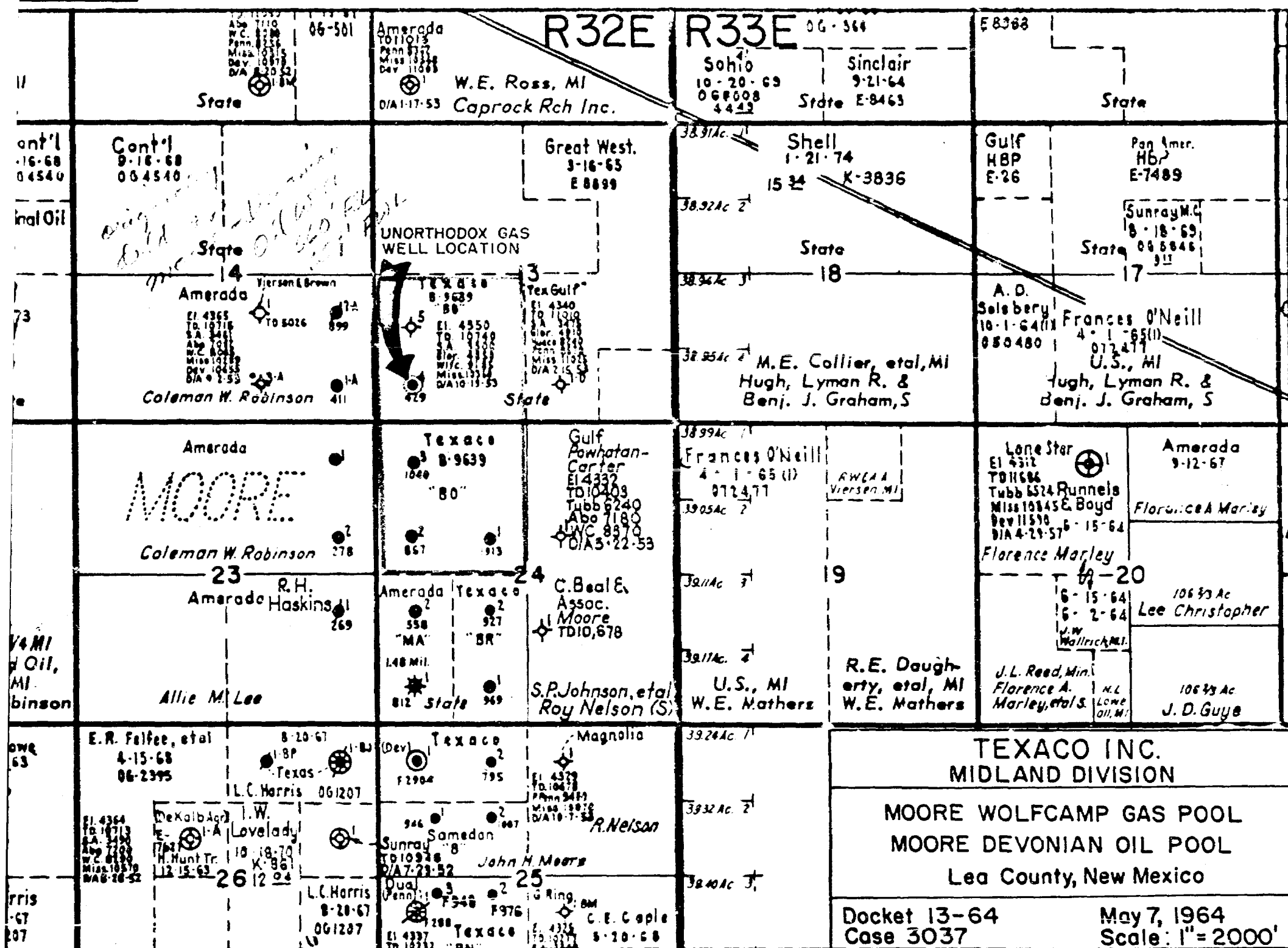

Gentlemen:

Texaco Inc. respectfully requests administrative approval for exception to Statewide Rule 104, paragraph 2 (d) which specifies the location of a gas well as being no nearer than 660' to an outer boundary line of a tract nor closer than 330' to any quarter-quarter section. This request is as provided by paragraph 2 (f) of Rule 104 which states that the Secretary of the Commission shall have authority to grant these exceptions under certain conditions.

The above subject request is requested for Texaco's anticipated recompletion of the State of New Mexico "B0" Well No. 4 located in Unit M, Section 13, T-11-S, R-32-E, Lea County, New Mexico. This well is located 660' from the south line and 659' from the west line of Section 13, being one foot closer to the boundary line than is authorized in Statewide Regulations. The subject well is presently completed in and producing from the Moore (Devonian) Reservoir from the interval 10,604' to 10,629'. Upon approval of this application, the well will be plugged back from the present oil completion and recompleted in the Wolfcamp between the approximate interval from 8165' to 8214'.

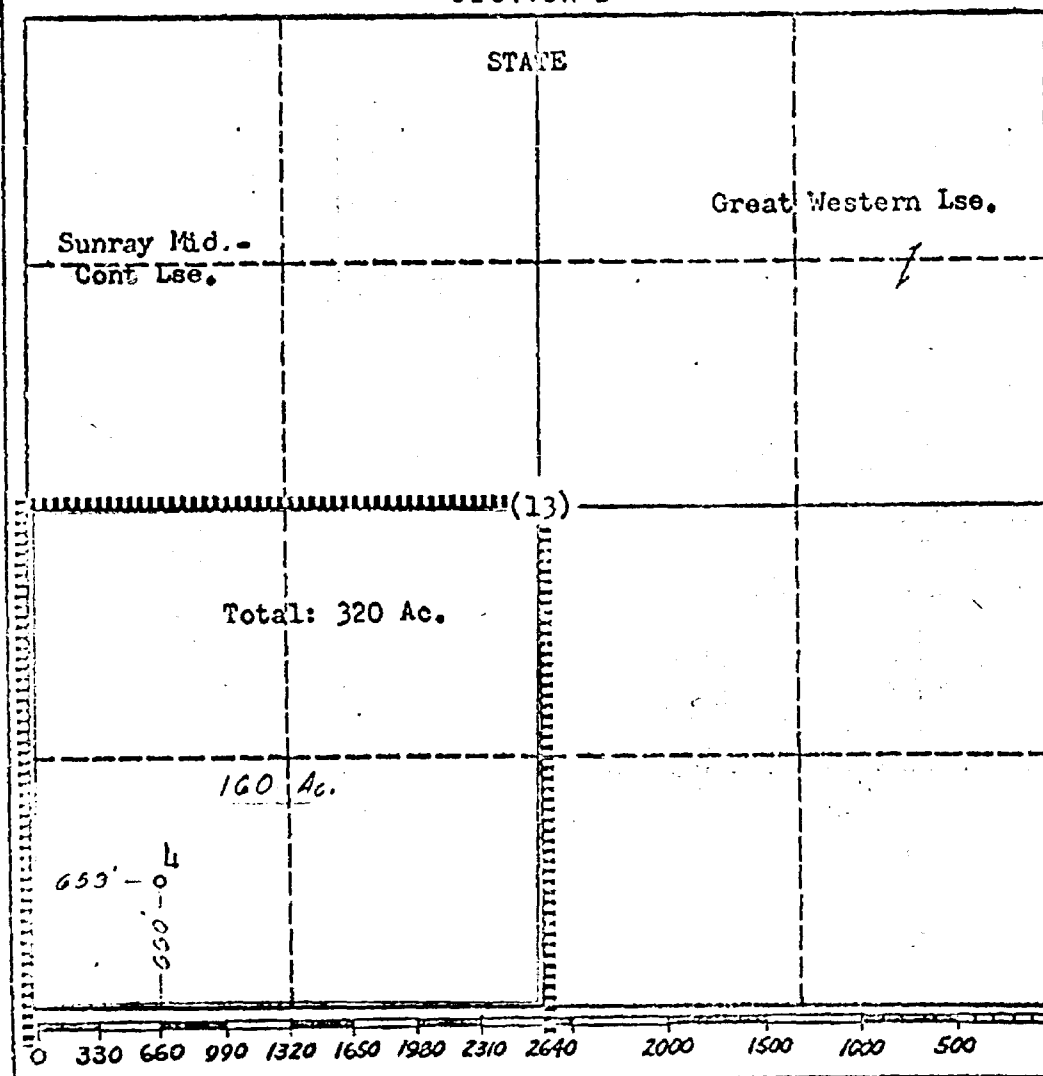

TRANSCRIPT OF HEARING

MR. NUTTER: The hearing will come to order, please.
The first case will be 3037.

MR. DURRETT: Application of Texaco, Inc. for an unorthodox location, Lea County, New Mexico.

MR. NUTTER: Call that a massive unorthodox location.

MR. KELLY: Booker Kelly, Gilbert, White and Gilbert, appearing on behalf of Texaco, Inc. We have one witness and ask that he be sworn.

(Witness sworn.)

(Whereupon, Applicant's Exhibit No. 1 marked for identification.)

CARL L. WHIGHAM, JR.

called as a witness, having been first duly sworn on oath, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. KELLY:

Q Would you state your name, position, and employer, please?

A My name is Carl Whigham. I'm employed by Texaco, Inc. as Midland Division Proration Engineer.

Q Have you previously testified before the Commission?

A Yes, sir.

MR. KELLY: Are the witness' qualifications acceptable?

MR. NUTTER: They are.



Q (By Mr. Kelly) Would you please state what Texaco seeks by the application?

A Texaco seeks an exception to State-wide Rule 104, paragraph 2 (d), which stipulates that the location of a State-wide gas well in New Mexico shall be no nearer than 660 feet from the outer boundary line of a tract or lease.

Q Referring to what has been marked Exhibit No. 1, that shows the location of the existing well; that is now an oil well, is that right?

A The well was originally drilled as a Moore-Devonian oil well and it's presently producing from that pool.

Q As an oil well within the proper spacing?

A That's right.

Q And now you are going to produce in a gas zone?

A That's correct.

Q What's the extent of the deviation?

A Actually the well is 659 feet from the west line of Section 13, being one foot too close to the lease line.

MR. KELLY: I have no further questions.

MR. NUTTER: Does anyone have any questions of Mr. Whigham?

MR. DURRETT: I have a question.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. DURRETT:

Q Mr. Whigham, are you going to plug back now on this well



or deepen it, or is it a dual?

A It's presently a single completion in the Moore-Devonian, but it is no longer economic to operate so it's planned to plug back to the Wolfcamp interval and produce it as a gas well.

Q Do you have figures on your production from the oil zone, just as a matter of interest?

A Yes, the well makes about ten barrels of oil a day and about 2,000 barrels of water per month, and at that depth with that much water being produced, it's uneconomical to operate it. Actually, if it cannot or could not be completed in the Wolfcamp gas reservoir, it would have to be plugged and abandoned for economic reasons.

Q Did Texaco drill this well or did they purchase it after it had been drilled by another operator?

A It's my understanding that Texaco drilled it.

Q Was there a reason that the well wasn't drilled on a 660 location originally?

A I wouldn't know what that reason might be. It could be an error in surveying. Our first step after finding that we did not comply with the standard gas well location was to resurvey the well, and that was done, and I don't recall the exact figure but it came out about the same. It was 658 and a fraction again.

So our Civil Engineering people submitted those figures and it showed that the well was still an unorthodox gas well

A That's simply a guess on my part.

MR. DURRETT: Thank you.

BY MR. NUTTER:

Q Mr. Whigham, in your opinion, will this deviation of twelve inches from the State-wide pattern result in the violation of anyone's correlative rights?

A No, sir.

Q Only twelve inches worth, anyway?

A That's right.

MR. NUTTER: Are there any further questions of Mr. Whigham?

MR. KELLY: Was Exhibit 1 prepared by you or under your supervision?

A Yes, sir.

MR. KELLY: We move the introduction of Exhibit No. 1.

MR. NUTTER: Texaco's Exhibit No. 1 will be admitted in evidence.

(Whereupon, Applicant's Exhibit No. 1 received in evidence.)

MR. NUTTER: If there are no further questions, you may be excused.

(Witness excused.)



MR. NUTTER: Do you have anything further, Mr. Kelly?

MR. KELLY: Nothing further.
