Gentlemen:

Humble Oil & Refining Company has requested that we waive objection to the drilling of their #2 well in their Alves 80-acre unit in Section 7, 19S 35E.

We object to this proposed location and we request that the Commission not create any non-standard proration units in this field.

Humble drilled their #1 Alves well after a hearing had been called for field rules, but before the hearing was held, in such a manner as to cause irregular locations, and the granting of their #2 well on this same unit would further promote irregular locations. To allow the two wells with non-standard proration units would in effect place their two wells on 40-acre spacing, while our wells would be on 80-acre spacing. You will notice the #2 well location is not even in the middle of the 40-acre tract. It is our impression that Humble would be unwilling to drill on the western side of their proposed non-standard proration units.

We will appreciate your consideration of our request in this matter.

- CASE 3081: Application of Shell Oil Company for a waterflood project, Lea County, New Mexico. Applicant, in the above-styled cause, seeks authority to institute a waterflood project in the Langlie-Mattix Pool by the injection of water through four wells at unorthodox locations in Section 21, Township 24 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico.
- CASE 3082: Application of Union Oil Company of California for salt water disposal, Lea County, New Mexico. 
