ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock a.m. on February 10, 1965, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Daniel S. Nutter.

NOW, on this 5th day of March, 1965, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Continental Oil Company, seeks an exception to Rule 4 of the Special Rules and Regulations governing the Baish-Wolfcamp Pool and to Rule 4 of the Special Rules and Regulations governing the Maljamar-Abo Pool to permit the location of its Baish "A" Well No. 13 at an unorthodox location for said pools 1780 feet from the North line and 460 feet from the West line of Section 22, Township 17 South, Range 32 Zast, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.
- (3) That the subject well was drilled at the above-described location to avoid interference with an existing well.
- (4) That approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the oil in the pools, and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- (1) That the applicant, Continental Oil Company, is hereby granted an exception to the well location requirements of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Baish-Wolfcamp and Maljamar-Abo Pools to permit the location of its Baish "A" Well No. 13 at an unorthodox location for said pools 1780 feet from the North line and 460 feet from the West line of Section 22, Township 17 South, Range 32 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.
- (2) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.



Centlemen:

Continental Oil Company respectfully requests administrative approval, in exception to Rule 4 of the Special Pool Rules for the Baish-Wolfcamp and Maljamar=Abo Pools contained in Order Nos. R-2765 and R-2766, for an unorthodox location 1780 feet from the North line and 460 feet from the West line of Section 22, Township 17 South, Range 32 East, Lea County, New Mexico for its Baish "A" Well No. 13, as provided in Rule 5 of the same orders.

In support of this request we respectfully submit the following:

- 1. Applicant is the owner and operator of the Baish "A" lease, comprising W/2, NE/4 and N/2 SE/4 of Section 21 and W/2 NW/4 Section 22, T=17S, R=32E.
- 2. Applicant drilled and completed its No. 13 well on said lease as a producer in the Baish-Wolfcomp and Maijamar Abo Pools, as authorized by Order MC-1551, at a location 1780 feet from the North line and 460 feet from the West line of said section 22.
- 3. Said well was noved 200 feet borth and 200 feet West of the standard location in order to avoid interference with applicant's Baish "A" ho 2, a temporarily abandoned Maljemar producer located 1989 feet from the North line and 660 feet from the West line of said section 22

- 4. Said location is removed a greater distance from the center of the quarter quarter section than is permitted by Rule 4 of the Special Pool Rules contained in Order Nos. Re2765 and Re2766.
- 5. The attached plat shows to the best of our knowledge and belief the area surrounding said well, the location of leases and wells and the ownership thereofe As shown thereon, applicant owns all offsetting leaseholds.
- 6. The granting of this application is in the interest of preventing waste and protecting correlative rights。





MR. DURRETT: Application of Continental Oil Company for an unorthodox location, Lea County, New Mexico.

MR. KELLAHIN: Jason Kellahin of Kellahin and Fox, Santa Fe, representing the Applicant. We have one witness that we'd like to have sworn.

(Whereupon, Applicant's Exhibit 1 marked for identification.)

V. T. L Y O N, called as a witness herein, having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. KELLAHIN:

- State your name, please. Q
- V. T. Lyon, L-y-o-n.
- By whom are you employed and in what capacity?
- I am employed by Continental Oil Company as Supervising Engineer in our Hobbs District Office, located in Hobbs, New Mexico.
- Have you testified before the Commission and are your qualifications a matter of record?
 - Yes, sir. A

MR. KELLAHIN: Are the witness' qualifications acceptable?


MR. UTZ: They are.



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- (By Mr. Kellahin) Mr. Lyon, are you familiar with the application of Continental in Case No. 3205?
 - Yes, sir.
 - 0 Will you state what is proposed in this application?
- Case No. 3205 is the application of Continental Oil Company for approval of an unorthodox location for our Baish "A" Number 13 well which is located 1780 feet from the north line and 460 feet from the west line of Section 22, Township 17 South, Range 32 East, Lea County, New Mexico. This location is an exception to the field rules for the Baish Wolfcamp and Maljamar-Abo Pools which is found in Orders No. R-2765 and R-2766.
 - And what occasioned this unorthodox location?
- Continental was unable to drill this well at the center of the quarter section because of the fact that Baish "A" Number 2 and a Greyburg-San Andres well were already located at that location. Continental has two general policies with respect to well spacing which affect this hearing. First, it's our general policy to drill all wells in the center of the quarter section; and second, if there is a pre-existing well at this location, it is our policy to move well away from the well to avoid any possibility of interference with the pre-existing well.
 - Referring to what has been marked as Exhibit Number Q

1 Mr. Lyon, would you identify that Exhibit and discuss the information shown in it?

A Exhibit Number 1 is a location and ownership map showing the Baish "A" lease and the surrounding area, the wells that have been drilled in this area. It shows the Baish "A" Number 13 which is the subject of this Hearing circled in red. It shows that the Baish "A" Number 2 is located in the center of the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 22, and that also located in this same quarter section are the MCA Well Number 40 and Baish "A" Number 13.

It also shows that the Baish "A" lease consists of the West Half of the Northwest Quarter of Section 22 and all of Section 21, with the exception of the South Half of the Southeast Quarter. The Number 13 well was moved toward the interior of the lease rather than to the nearest boundary and it also shows that there are no operators other than Continental offsetting the quarter-quarter section upon which the well is located.

- Q Now, has this well already been drilled, Mr. Lyon?
- A Yes, sir.
- Q Will you discuss how this occurred, please?
- A Well, as you will recall, Continental Oil Company presented the testimony which resulted in the field rules of these two pools. This Hearing was held August 26, 1964 and



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the Order was entered September 8th, 1964. Prior to the date that the order was received in our office, that of course being after the date of the hearing, the authorization for this well was prepared and somehow, due to a lack of communications the people who participated in the Hearing failed to communicate with the people who prepared the authorization; and this authorization was processed and the well was drilled before it came to our attention that the well was actually in violation of the rules.

- Now, this fact was brought to your attention by the Commission?
- Yes, sir, Mr. Ramey of the Hobbs Office called us and told us about it.
- MR. UTZ: Mr. Lyon, is the well within 150 feet of the center?
 - Α Yes, sir.
- (By Mr. Kellahin) Now, are any offset operators in your opinion affected by the offset of this well?
 - No, sir.
- There are no operators offsetting in the acreage involved besides Continental Oil?
 - No, sir, that is correct.
- Is the structure location of the well higher than, lower then, or --



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The structure location has been changed very little. It is slightly higher structurally. The difference in structure from this location where the well is drilled and the nearest orthodox location is virtually insignificant, but of course, we had to move the well away from the center quarterquarter section. For normal good business reasons we moved it upstream.

Does Continental consider the tolerance of within 150 feet of the center of the quarter-quarter section too restricting?

No, sir, we believe that wells can be drilled within 150 feet of another well without undue danger of interference, and in the future, we intend to drill our wells in conformance.

0 Was Exhibit Number 1 prepared by you or under your supervision?

A Yes, sir.

MR. KELDAHIN: At this time, I would like to offer Exhibit Number 1 into evidence.

> (Whereupon, Applicant's Exhibit 1 offered into evidence.)

MR. UTZ: Continental Exhibit Number 1 will be admitted into evidence.
