ORDER OF THE DIVISION

BY THE DIVISION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on February 13, 1980, at Santa Pe, New Mexico, before Examiner Daniel S. Nutter.

NOW, on this <u>llth</u> day of March, 1980, the Division Director, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Division has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Meadco Properties, Ltd., seeks an exception to the casing/cementing rules for the Oil-Potash Area as promulgated by Order No. R-111-A to permit a proposed well to be located in Unit L of Section 4, Township 21 South, Range 29 East, Eddy County, New Mexico, to be completed by setting surface casing at 550 feet and production casing at a total depth of approximately 4500 feet and cementing both casing strings to the surface.
- (3) That the evidence presented indicates that there are no potash mining operations nor deposits of commercial potash ore in proximity to the proposed well or to the above described lands and that the proposed method of completion will not result in endangerment of potash resources nor operations.
- (4) That the applicant should report the following both to the district office of the Division and the U.S.G.S:

- (a) Any water flows encountered; and
- (b) The top of the cement around the production casing as determined by temperature survey if such cement does not circulate.
- (5) That the applicant may be required to re-cement the production casing if the cement on said string fails to circulate to the surface.
- (6) That approval of the subject application will protect correlative rights, will prevent waste and will not cause the waste of potash.
 - (7) The application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That the applicant, Meadco Properties, Ltd., is hereby authorized an exception to the casing/cementing rules for the Oil-Potash Area as promulgated by Order No. R-111-A to permit a proposed well which will be located in Unit L of Section 4, Township 21 South, Range 29 East, NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico, to be completed by setting surface casing at 550 feet and production casing at total depth of approximately 4500 feet and cementing both casing strings to the surface.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, the applicant shall report the following, both to the district office of the Division and the U.S.G.S:

- (a) Any water flows encountered; and
- (b) The top of the cement around the production casing as determined by temperature survey if such cement does not circulate.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that the applicant may be required to re-cement the production casing to the surface if cement on said casing did not circulate to the surface.

(2) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.

a. Meadco would like an exception to R-111-A casing program in their proposed Delaware Sand test, which we would like to leave out one string of casing and cementing the production string back to the surface, which would be quite a bit of savings to Meadco and then we would still protect the potash in this area.

Now, referring to what has been marked as the Applicant's Exhibit Number One, would you identify that exhibit, please?

A. Exhibit One is a land plat, which I've shown in yellow is acreage that is controlled by Meadco, with the exception of Lot 11 there in Section 4. This is in

We own those three sections with the exception of that 40 acres surrounding that gas well that's located there, which is owned by Wesbrook.

R-111 outline is shown in black that I have marked with an arrow R-111-A that goes along the west side of Section 4 and then continues on up in the next township there. Our proposed location, which is shown in red, in Lot 12 there, our "L" location, is adjacent to the west side of the R-111-A outline as presented to me by the USGS.

Q Would you give the location of your proposed test?

A. The actual footage is 3153 feet from the north and 660 from the west line of Section 4, Township 21 South, Range 29 East, Eddy County.

Q. Now referring to what has been marked as Exhibit Number Two, would you identify that exhibit, please?

A. Exhibit Two is a schematic of our proposed casing program showing what we propose to do, how we propose to cement and complete the Delaware Sand Well, if it's productive, at 4500 feet.

Now in both the surface string and the production string will be cemented to the surface, is that correct?

A. Yes, both of them will be cemented back

to the surface.

Now in your opinion will that type of completion fully protect the potash zone?

I feel like it will.

Do you know the approximate depth of the potash zone in this area?

The top of the salt is about 600 and the base of it is about 1550.

So that will be fully covered with cement.

Right, yes, sir.

Is there any water in the area? Fresh water?

Not in this area; not at this depth.

Near the surface is there any fresh water? Do you know of any?

I don't believe so.

In the event there is, would the completion fully protect the fresh water zone?

Yes, all the casing will be cemented back to the surface to fully protect all the water.

Now referring to Exhibit Number Three, would you identify that exhibit, please?

Exhibit Number Three is a letter as a result of a telephone call that I had with Mississippi Chemical to a Mr. Walls and Mr. Tim Hall, who is their plant superintendent, and in the latter part of January I called

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and discussed this exception order that we were asking for, and he said that Mississippi Chemical had no objections, to please write him a letter telling him what it would do and on the back page leave a place where they could sign it.

So I did that and Mr. J. R. Walls has signed the letter on the back side saying that 'they're agreed to our exception, or they did not agree -- disagree to this proposal. And Tim Hall, the plant superintendent, told me before they signed it, that they had checked with the Potash Company of America, or PCA, that they would sign it if there was no objection. So the letter came back signed so I presume that there was no objection to us -- if we could get the Commission to agree that we could do the exception cementing program.

Q Did you also write to the P Ash Company of America?



In response to your letter dated October 16, 1979, I called your Mine Superintendent, Mr. Tim Hall, and discussed in detail our plans for drilling two wells and their locations. I also discussed the possibility of acquiring an exception to Rule R-VII-A from the Oil & Gas Commission to set a string of casing at 550' above the salt, cementing to the surface and to eliminate the second salt string by cementing our 4 1/2" production string from TD to the surface. Mr. Hall's opinion was that Mississippi Chemical would be agreeable to this casing exception procedure. I am attaching a schematic of this program. We are hoping that we will be able to develop most of Section 4, T-21-S, R-29-E, and would like to use this casing program for all wells. This would be a savings of approximately \$50,000 per well.

I am leaving a space for your approval to this casing program exception to the R-111-A Casing Program. Please execute and return one copy to us.





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

as promulgated by Order No. R-111-A to permit a proposed well to be located in Unit L of Section 4, Township 21 South, Range 29 East, Eddy County, New Mexico, to be completed by setting surface casing at 550 feet and production of approximate, 4500 feet casing at total depth and cementing both casing strings to the surface.
