SUPPLEMENTAL GAS PRORATION ORDER FOR THE MONTH
OF SEPTEMBER, 1973

This cause came on for public hearing by the Commission's Examiner, Elvis A. Utz, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, on August 9, 1973, at 9 a.m., pursuant to legal notice for the purpose of setting the allowable production of gas from the following nine gas pools in San Juan, Rio Arriba, and Sandoval Counties, New Mexico, for the month of September, 1973.

Basin-Dakota, Blanco-Mesaverde, Aztec-Pictured Cliffs, Ballard-Pictured Cliffs, Blanco-Pictured Cliffs, South, Fulcher Kutz-Pictured Cliffs, Kutz-Pictured Cliffs, West, Tapacito-Pictured Cliffs, and Devils Fork-Gallup.

NOW, on this 13th day of August, 1973, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the supplemental nominations of purchasers, the capacity of producing wells, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being otherwise fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That the total nomination of purchasers of gas produced from the above-listed nine gas pools for the month of September, 1973, is 46,678,100 Mcf. The individual pool nominations are as follows:

Basin-Dakota	17,173,300 Mcf
Blanco-Mesaverde	21,765,600 Mcf
Aztec-Pictured Cliffs	1,133,300 Mcf
Ballard-Pictured Cliffs	1,178,400 Mcf
Blanco-Pictured Cliffs, South	3,555,700 Mcf
Fulcher Kutz-Pictured Cliffs	780,100 Mcf
Kutz-Pictured Cliffs, West	339,100 Mcf
Tapacito-Pictured Cliffs	695,600 Mcf
Devils Fork-Gallup	57,000 Mcf

(2) That the potential producing capacity of all gas wells in the nine gas pools listed above is in excess of the nominations of purchasers of gas, and in order to prevent waste and protect correlative rights, the production of gas from the above-listed nine gas pools should be limited, allocated, and distributed during the month of September, 1973.

(3) That all the producing gas wells, together with the expected completed or recompleted wells in the nine gas pools listed above, can produce a total of 46,678,100 Mcf without causing waste during the month of September, 1973, and an allocation based upon such production would be reasonable and would protect correlative rights.
