SUPPLEMENTAL GAS PRORATION ORDER FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1976

This cause came on for public hearing by the Commission's Examiner, Daniel S. Nutter, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, on January 14, 1976, at 9 a.m., pursuant to legal notice for the purpose of setting the allowable production of gas from the following five gas pools in San Juan, Rio Arriba, and Sandoval Counties, New Mexico, for the month of February, 1976.

Basin-Dakota, Blanco-Mesaverde, Blanco-Pictured Cliffs, South, Tapacito-Pictured Cliffs, and Devils Fork-Gallup

NOW, on this 20th day of January, 1976, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the supplemental nominations of purchasers, the capacity of producing wells, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being otherwise fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That the total nomination of purchasers of gas produced from the above-listed five gas pools for the month of February, 1976, is 36,912,200 Mcf. The individual pool nominations are as follows:

Basin-Dakota	13,733,800	Mcf
Blanco-Mesaverde	19,591,500	Mcf
Blanco-Pictured Cliffs, South	2,700,300	Mcf
Tapacito-Pictured Cliffs	861,600	Mcf
Devils Fork-Gallup	25,000	Mcf

- (2) That the potential producing capacity of all gas wells in the five gas pools listed above is in excess of the nominations of purchasers of gas, and in order to prevent waste and protect correlative rights, the production of gas from the above-listed five gas pools should be limited, allocated, and distributed during the month of February, 1976.
- (3) That all the producing gas wells, together with the expected completed or recompleted wells in the five gas pools listed above, can produce a total of 36,912,200 Mcf without causing waste during the month of February, 1976, and an allocation based upon such production would be reasonable and would protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That for the month of February, 1976, the allowable production to be assigned the five allocated gas pools in San Juan, Rio Arriba, and Sandoval Counties, New Mexico, is as follows:

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Basin-Dakota	13,733,800 M	1cf
Blanco-Mesaverde	19,591,500 M	ſcf
Blanco-Pictured Cliffs, South	2,700,300 M	1cf
Tapacito-Pictured Cliffs	861,600 M	1cf
Devils Fork-Gallup	25,000 M	1cf

- (2) That the allocation hereby set for the month of February, 1976, in the five allocated pools in San Juan, Rio Arriba and Sandoval Counties, New Mexico, shall be in accordance with the Commission Rules, Regulations, and Orders.
- (3) That a proration schedule, duly prepared by the Commission and thereafter adopted for the month of February, 1976, is hereto attached and made a part hereof; it distributes and allocates the allowable production among the gas wells in the five gas pools listed above for the period stated, in accordance with the Commission Rules, Regulations, and Orders.

The foregoing order shall remain effective until further order of the Commission.
