BY THE DIVISION:

This case came on for hearing at 8:15 a.m. on November 1, 2001, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner David R. Catanach.

NOW, on this <u>25th</u> day of January, 2002, the Division Director, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner,

FINDS THAT:


- (1) Due public notice has been given and the Division has jurisdiction of this case and its subject matter.
- (2) Phillips Pipe Line Company initially made application to the Division on April 6, 2001 for administrative approval of its Stage 2 Abatement Plan for remediation of soil and ground water contamination relating to a crude oil pipeline spill at its NM-1-1 site located in Unit N of Section 9, Township 19 South, Range 38 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.
- (3) Phillips Pipe Line Company also initially made application to the Division on March 7, 2001 for administrative approval of its Stage 2 Abatement Plan for remediation of soil and ground water contamination relating to a crude oil pipeline spill at its East Hobbs Junction site located in Unit N of Section 8, Township 19 South, Range 38 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.
- (4) Pursuant to an objection to the above-described applications filed by Mr. William F. McNeill on or about July 19, 2001, these applications were set to hearing.

- Prior to the hearing on November 1, 2001, the Division was made aware that Phillips Pipe Line Company had reached a tentative agreement with Mr. William F. McNeill whereby the objection to these applications would be withdrawn.
 - This case was subsequently dismissed at the November 1, 2001 hearing. (6)
- On January 23, 2002, the Division received a formal request from Mr. William F. McNeill requesting that this case be dismissed.
- Pursuant to the request by Mr. William F. McNeill, Case No. 12759 is hereby dismissed.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

Case No. 12759 is hereby <u>dismissed</u>.
