ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 10 a.m. on July 24, 1951, and August 7, 1951, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, befor the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission".

 $\underline{\text{NOW}}$, on this 19th day of November, 1951, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony adduced and the exhibits received at said hearings, and being fully advised in the premises,

- FINDS: (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That due to geological conditions, an orthodox location is unlikely to be productive and an unorthodox well location should be approved for the Roland Rich Woolley, Woolley Well No. 10, 1295 feet south of the north line and 1345 feet east of the west line of Section 31, Township 17 South, Range 3 East, NMPM, in the Loco Hills pool, Lea County, New Mexico.
- (3) That such location will not interfere with the correlative rights of adjoining lesses, and is in the interest of orderly development of the oil resources of the state.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED: That an unorthodox location for the Roland Rich Woolley, Woolley Well No. 10, 1295 feet south of the north line and 1345 feet east of the west line of Section 31, - Township 17 South, Range 30 East; NMPM, be, and the same hereby is approved.
