#### **ORDER OF THE DIVISION**

### **BY THE DIVISION:**

This case came on for hearing at 8:15 a.m. on December 21, 2000, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Michael E. Stogner.

NOW, on this <u>24th</u> day of January, 2001, the Division Director, having considered the record and the recommendations of the Examiner,

# FINDS THAT:

(1) Due public notice has been given and the Division has jurisdiction of this case and its subject matter.

(2) The applicant, Permian Resources Incorporated ("Permian"), seeks authorization to recomplete its Harrison Well No. 2 (**API No. 30-025-11690**), located 2310 feet from the South line and 990 feet from the East line (Unit I) of Section 22, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico, as a salt water disposal well into the Queen formation of the Langlie-Mattix Pool through the open hole interval from approximately 3,218 feet to 3,366 feet.

(3) Permian originally filed this application with the Division on July 27, 2000, for administrative review pursuant to the provisions of Division Rules 701.B and 701.C.

(4) An objection filed by the surface owners, George and Joyce Willis of Jal, New Mexico, on July 7, 2000, caused this application to be set for hearing.

(5) By letter dated November 20, 2000, the Willis's withdrew their objection. This case was then remanded to the Division's administrative process.

(6) By Administrative Order SWD-793, dated December 21, 2000, the Division approved the subject application, thereby making this case unnecessary.


(7) Furthermore, the applicant, prior to the hearing, requested this matter be dismissed.
