Dear Mr. Welsh:

Reference is made to the following: (i) your application dated June 28, 2000; and (ii) the records of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division ("Division") in Santa Fe: all concerning Cross Timbers Operating Company's ("Cross Timbers") request for an exception to the well location requirements provided within the "Special Rules and Regulations for the Basin-Dakota Pool," as promulgated by New Mexico Oil Conservation Division ("Division") Order No. R-10987, for a non-standard Basin-Dakota replacement gas well location within an existing standard 318.44-acre laydown gas spacing and proration unit for the Basin-Dakota Pool comprising Lots 3 through 7, NE/4 SW/4, and the N/2 SE/4 (S/2 equivalent) of Section 26, Township 30 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico. This unit is currently assigned to Cross Timbers' Fogelson Gas Com. Well No. 1 (API No. 30-045-09122), located a standard gas well location 1050 feet from the South line and 1000 feet from the East line (Lot 7/Unit P) of Section 26.

This application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rules 104.F and 605.B of the Rules and Regulations of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division ("Division").

Initial development of Basin-Dakota gas production within this 318.44-acre unit commenced in 1962 when International Oil Corporation drilled the above-described well. It is our understanding that the Fogleson Gas Com. Well No. 1 is currently shut-in and that Cross Timbers intends to plug and abandon the well.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Division Rule 104.F (2), the following described well to be drilled as a replacement to the initial gas well on this 318.44-acre gas spacing and proration unit at an unorthodox gas well location is hereby approved:

Fogelson Gas Com. Well No. 1-R 1980' FSL & 660' FEL (Unit I). Further, the aforementioned well and spacing unit will be subject to all existing rules, regulations, policies, and procedures applicable to prorated gas pools in Northwest, New Mexico.
