The Farmington District Office (FDO) of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has received your letters dated December 9, 1996 and January 2, 1997, requesting approval for downhole commingling of the Basin Fruiltland Coal and West Kutz Pictured Cliffs formations in the above referenced well.

For September 1996, the Pictured Cliffs formation was producing 92 Mcfd with a bottom hole pressure of 180 psi while for November 1996, the Fruitland Coal was producing 30 Mcfd with a bottom hole pressure of 175 psi. Both zones are marginal, so the average cumulative production for surrounding Pictured Cliffs wells (706,160 Mcf) and Fruitland Coal wells (454,079 Mcf) were used to determined a fixed percentage allocation.
