AMENDED ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER DHC-2442

Feuille "A" No. 5E API No. 30-045-26249 Unit K, Section 4, Township 29 North, Range 10 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico Undesignated Otero-Chacra (Gas – 82329), Blanco-Mesaverde (Prorated Gas – 72319) and Basin-Dakota (Prorated Gas – 71599) Pools

Dear Ms. Cole:

Reference is made to your recent application for an amendment to Division Order No. DHC-2442 dated August 23, 1999, which order authorized the downhole commingling of Blanco-Mesaverde and Basin-Dakota Gas Pool production within the well, to add the Otero-Chacra Gas Pool as a third commingled zone in the well.

It appearing that the subject well qualifies for approval for such amendment pursuant to the provisions of Rule 303.C., and that reservoir damage or waste will not result from such downhole commingling, and correlative rights will not be violated thereby, you are hereby authorized to commingle the production as described above and any Division Order which authorized the dual completion and required separation of the zones is hereby placed in abeyance.

The maximum amount of gas which may be produced daily from the well shall be determined by Division Rules and Regulations or by the gas allowable for each respective prorated pool as printed in the Division's San Juan Basin Gas Proration Schedule.

The applicant shall consult with the supervisor of the Aztec District Office of the Division upon completion and testing of the well in order to determine a fixed allocation of production from each of the commingled zones. Upon approval by the Division's Aztec District Office, the applicant shall submit the allocation formula to the Santa Fe Office of the Division.

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REMARKS: The operator shall notify the Aztec District Office of the Division upon implementation of the commingling process.

Pursuant to Rule 303.C.(2), the commingling authority granted herein may be rescinded by the Division Director if conservation is not being best served by such commingling.
