Gentlemen:

We hereby make application on behalf of our client, Aspen Crude
Purchasing Company, for the following relief, to-wit:

1. An unorthodox oil well location in the Totah-Gallup
Oil Pool at a point 1190 feet from the South line and
2210 feet from the East line of Section 11, Township
28 North, Range 13 West, N.M.P.M., San Juan County,
New Mexico. The foregoing unorthodox location is
necessitated by topographical conditions in the
quarter-quarter section which prevent the drilling of
a well at an orthodox location thereon. / Mr. Al Kendrick
in the Aztec office of the Oil Conservation Commission
has made a personal inspection of the subject area and
can confirm the existence of the topographical features
referred to above.

The oil and gas leasehold ownership within a radius of
790 feet from the above referenced location is common
with the ownership of the oil and gas leasehold estate
under said well.


