

Dear Mr. Porter:

Cactus Drilling Corporation drilled a test to the Pennsylvania located 540' fnl and 810' fel, Sec. 14, T30N, R18W. Cactus abandoned this well in early 1966. Subsequently, we have re-entered the well and completed it as an oil producer from the Dakota formation at 1000'.

While surveying other wells in this area, it was noted that an error was made originally in the location of the Shiprock #1 and the correct location is 735' fnl and 1360' fel. We are requesting administrative approval for an unorthodox location for our Shiprock #1 well. All of Section 14 is under the ownership of Thomas A. Dugan.


