XTO Energy, Inc. is hereby authorized to surface commingle Kutz Pictured Cliffs Gas Pool (79680), and Basin Fruitland Coal Gas Pool (71629) gas production from the Federal lease No. NMSF-078872A and the following wells.

Commingled gas production from the wells detailed above shall be measured and sold at the Central Tank Battery located in (Unit K) of Section 15, Township 27 North, Range 11 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico.

Gas production from the wells shall be continuously measured with allocation meters before commingling with production from other wells. The allocation meters shall be calibrated semi-annually. The commingled production from the wells is approved for off-lease measurement and sales. Any liquid hydrocarbon production shall not be commingled.

NOTE: This installation shall be installed and operated in accordance with the applicable Division Rules and Regulations. The producer/Operator shall notify the transporter of this commingling authority.

FURTHER: The operator shall notify the Aztec district office of the Division prior to implementation of commingling operations.
