ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 701, Skelly Oil Company has made application to the Commission on May 26, 1965, for permission to expand its Lovington San Andres Unit Water Flood Project in the Lovington-San Andres Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 10th day of June, 1965, the Secretary-Director finds:

- 1. That application has been filed in due form.
- 2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
- 3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Rule 701.
- 4. That the proposed injection well is eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Rule 701.
- 5. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
 - 6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Skelly Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the San Andres formation through the following-described well for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:

Unit Well No. 1 located in the SE/4 SE/4 of Section 25, Township 16 South, Range 36 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.

<u>PROVIDED HOWEVER</u>, That applicant shall inject water through tubing with a packer set at approximately 4560 feet in the $5 \ 1/2$ -inch casing in said well.
