ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 701, Sunray DX Oil Company has made application to the Commission on June 14, 1967, for permission to expand its SDX Metex Water Flood Project in the Grayburg-Jackson Pool, Eddy County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 29th day of June, 1967, the Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been filed in due form.
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all off-set operators have been duly notified of the application.
3. That no objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Rule 701.
4. That the proposed injection wells are eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Rule 701.
5. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:


That the applicant, Sunray DX Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Grayburg formation through the following described wells for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:

M. Dodd "B" Well No. 2 located in Unit H of Section 14,
M. Dodd "B" Well No. 4 located in Unit B of Section 14, and
M. Dodd "B" Well No. 22 located in Unit J of Section 14, all
in Township 17 South, Range 29 East, NMPM.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall inject water through tubing with packers set well below the top of cement surrounding the production casing in said wells.

DONE at Santa Fe, New Mexico, on the day and year hereinabove designated.
